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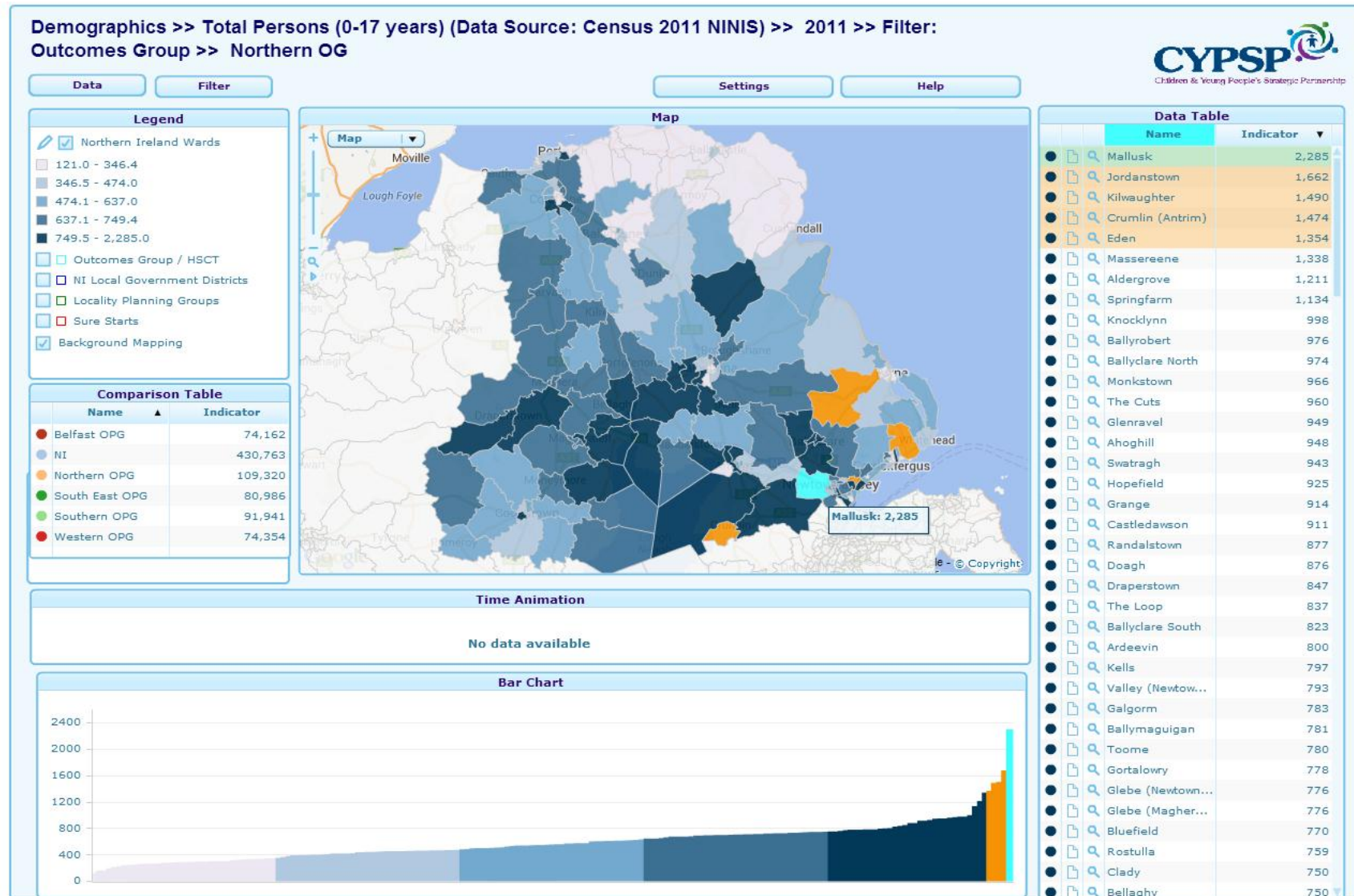
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## DEMOGRAPHICS

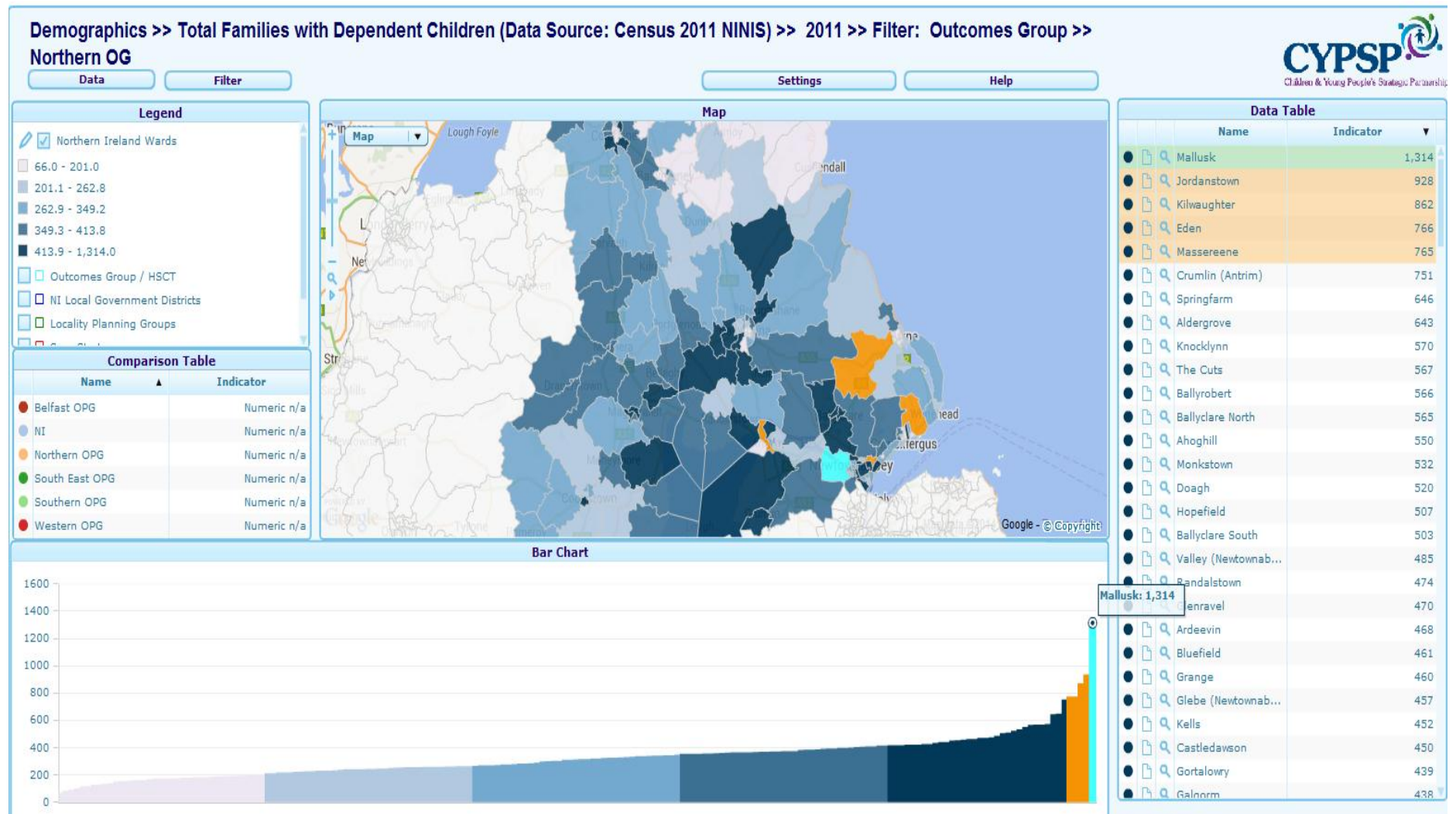

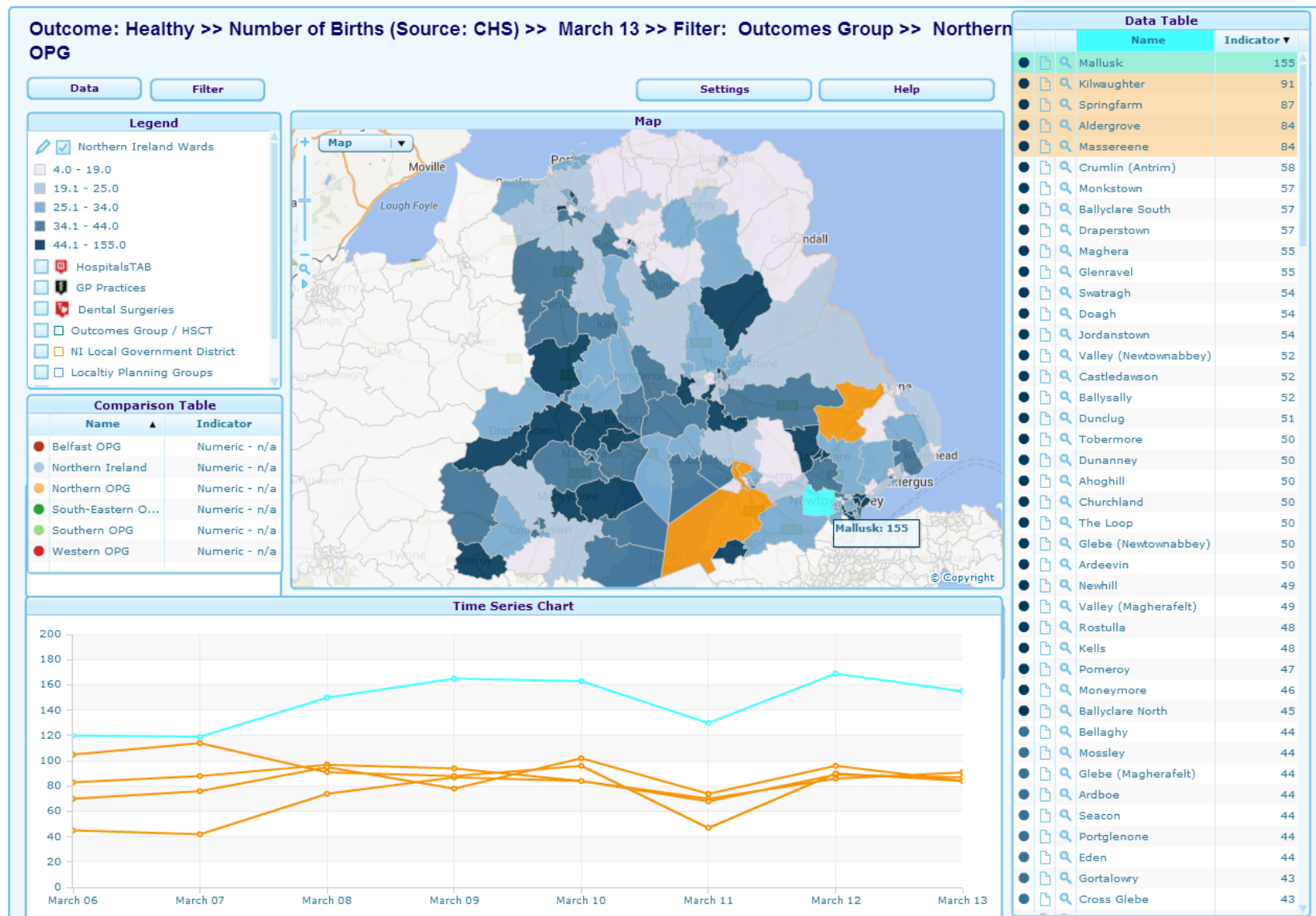

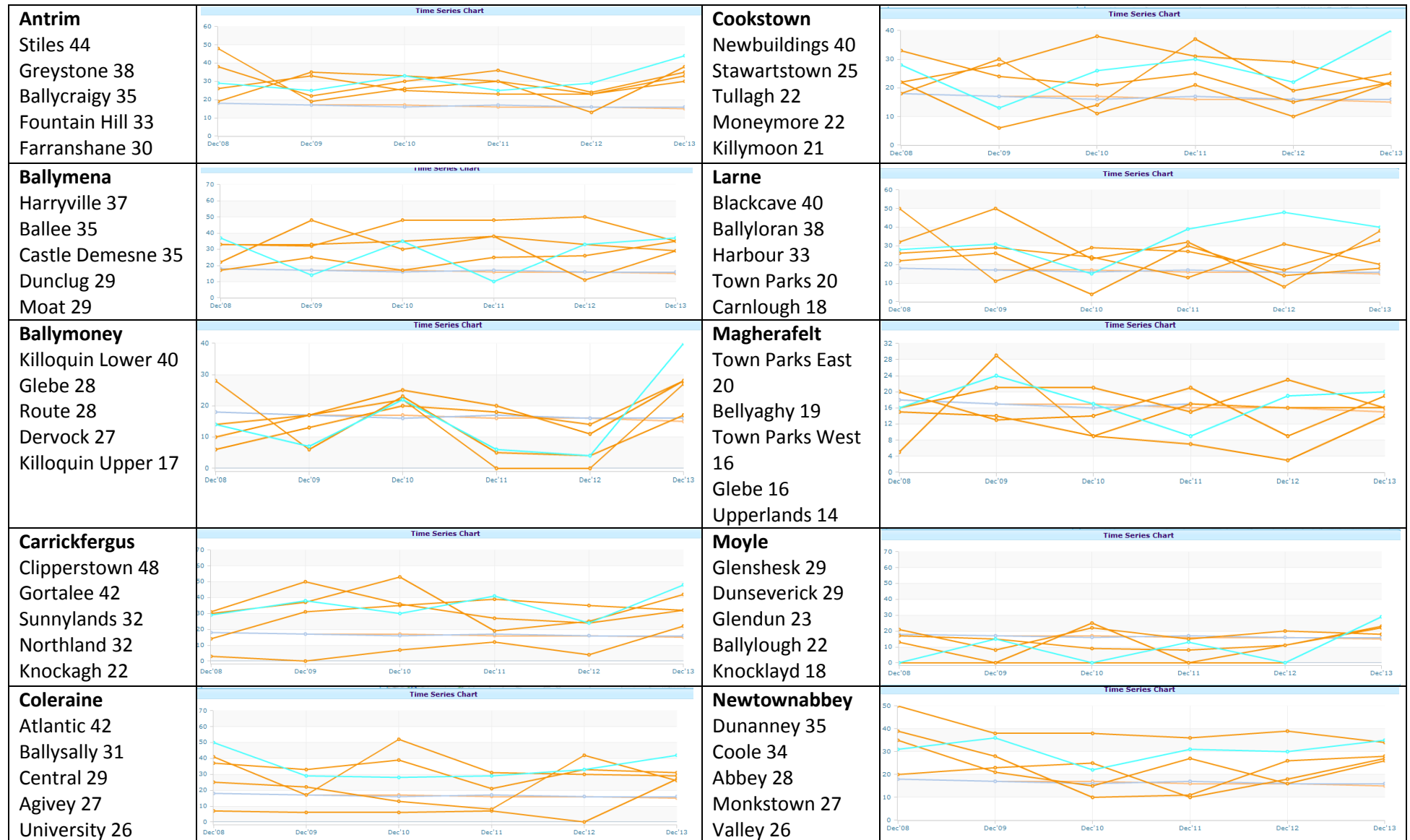

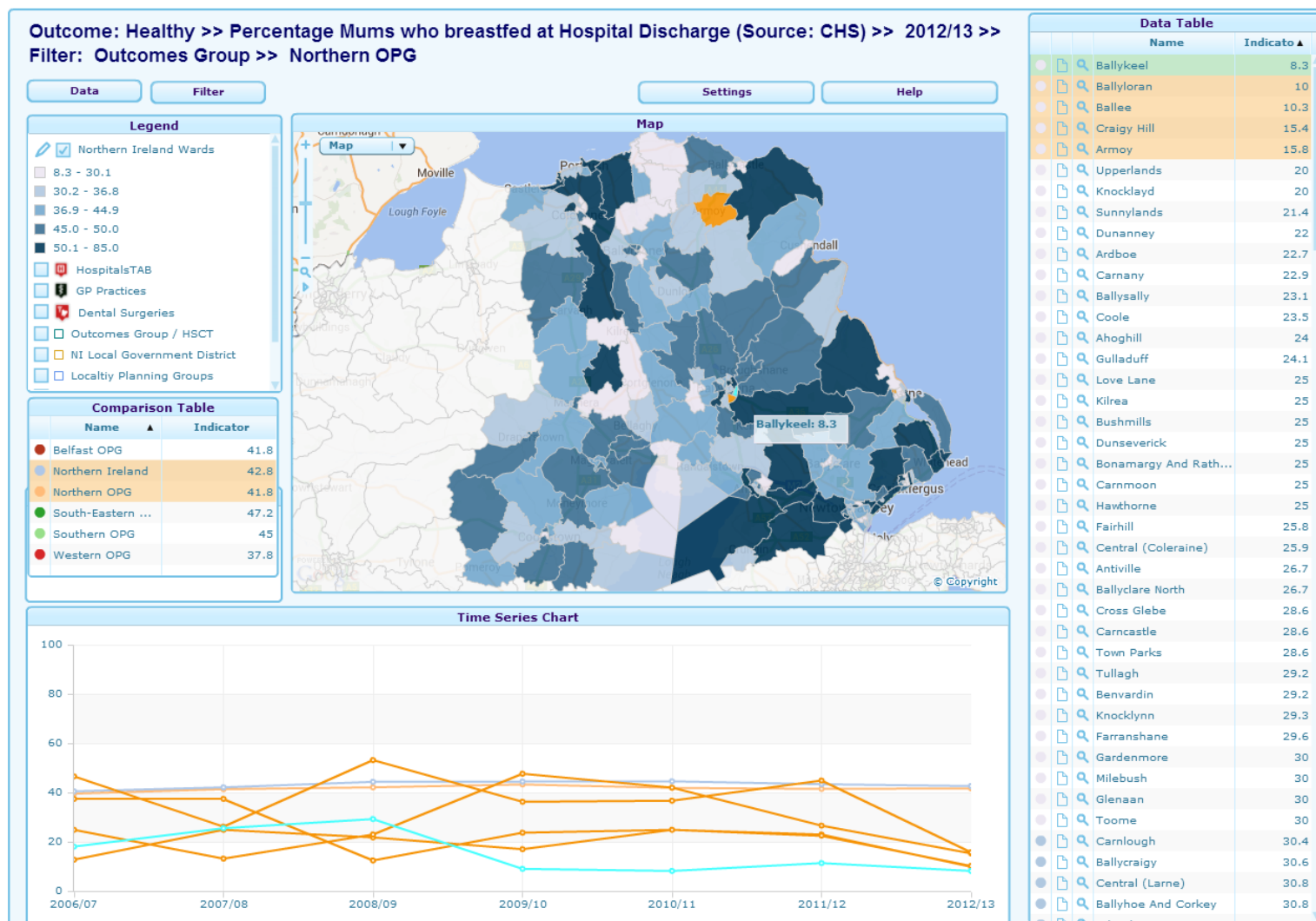

# MUMS SMOKING DURING PREGNANCY AT DEC 2013

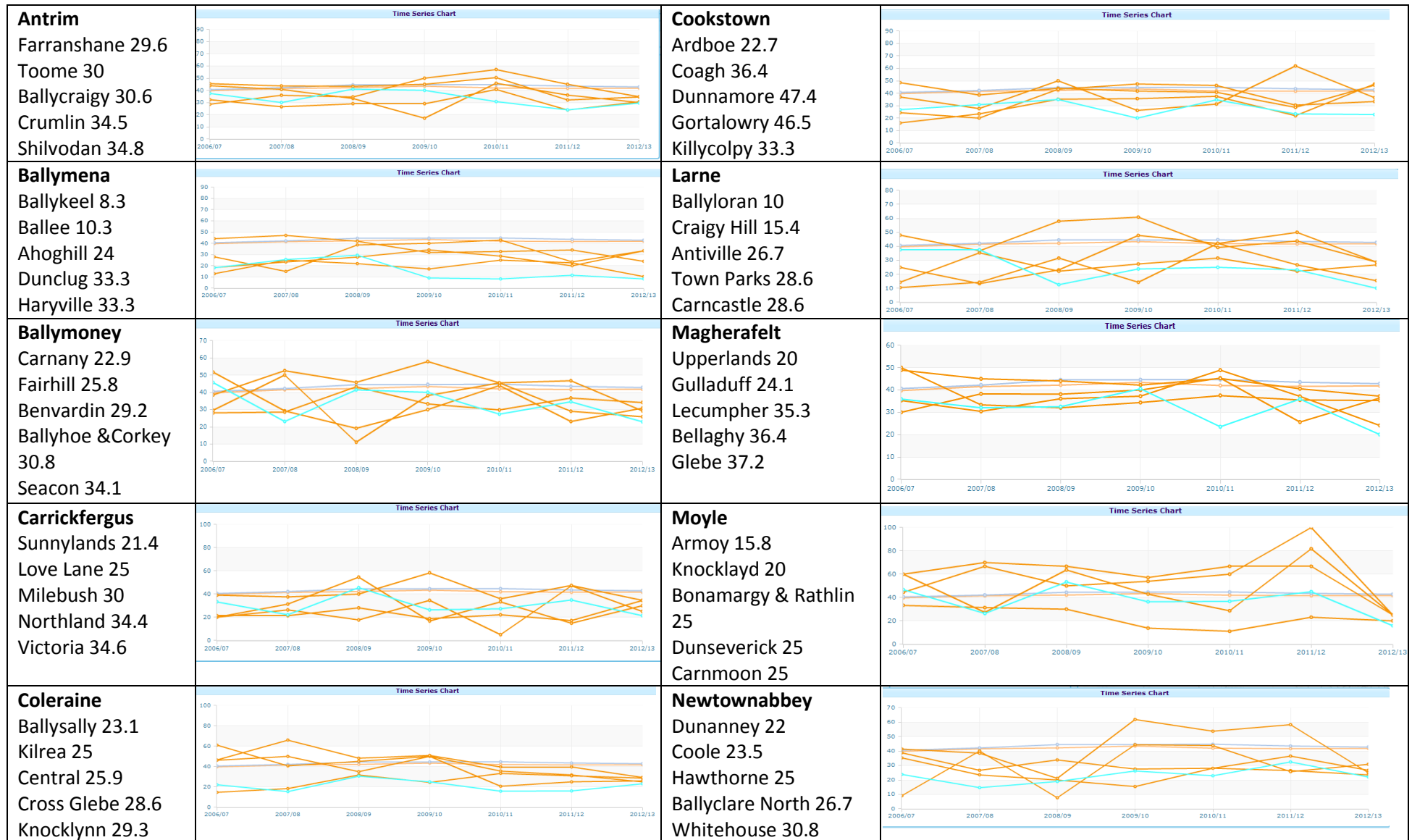

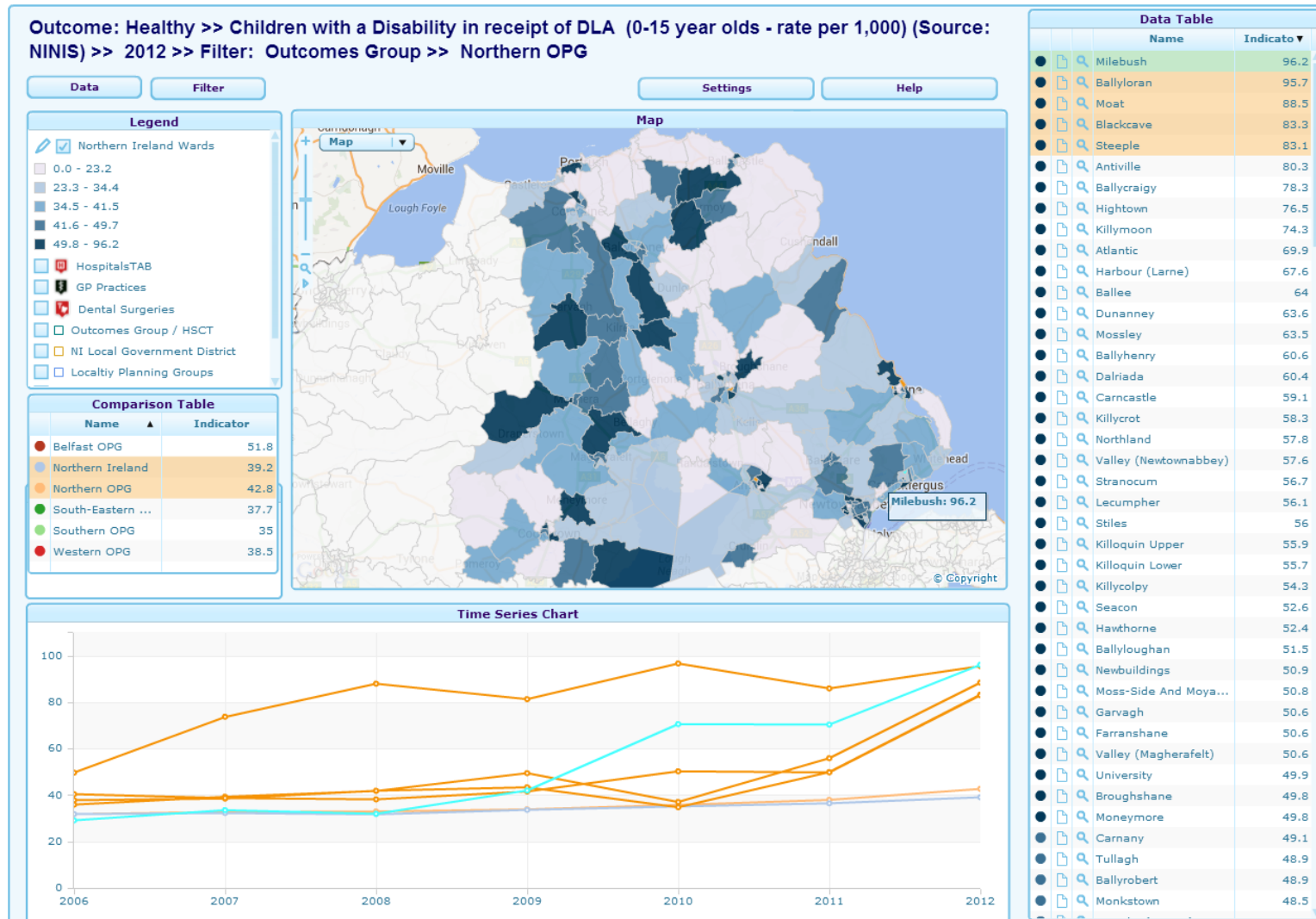

# PERCENTAGE MUMS BREASTFEEDING AT MARCH 2013





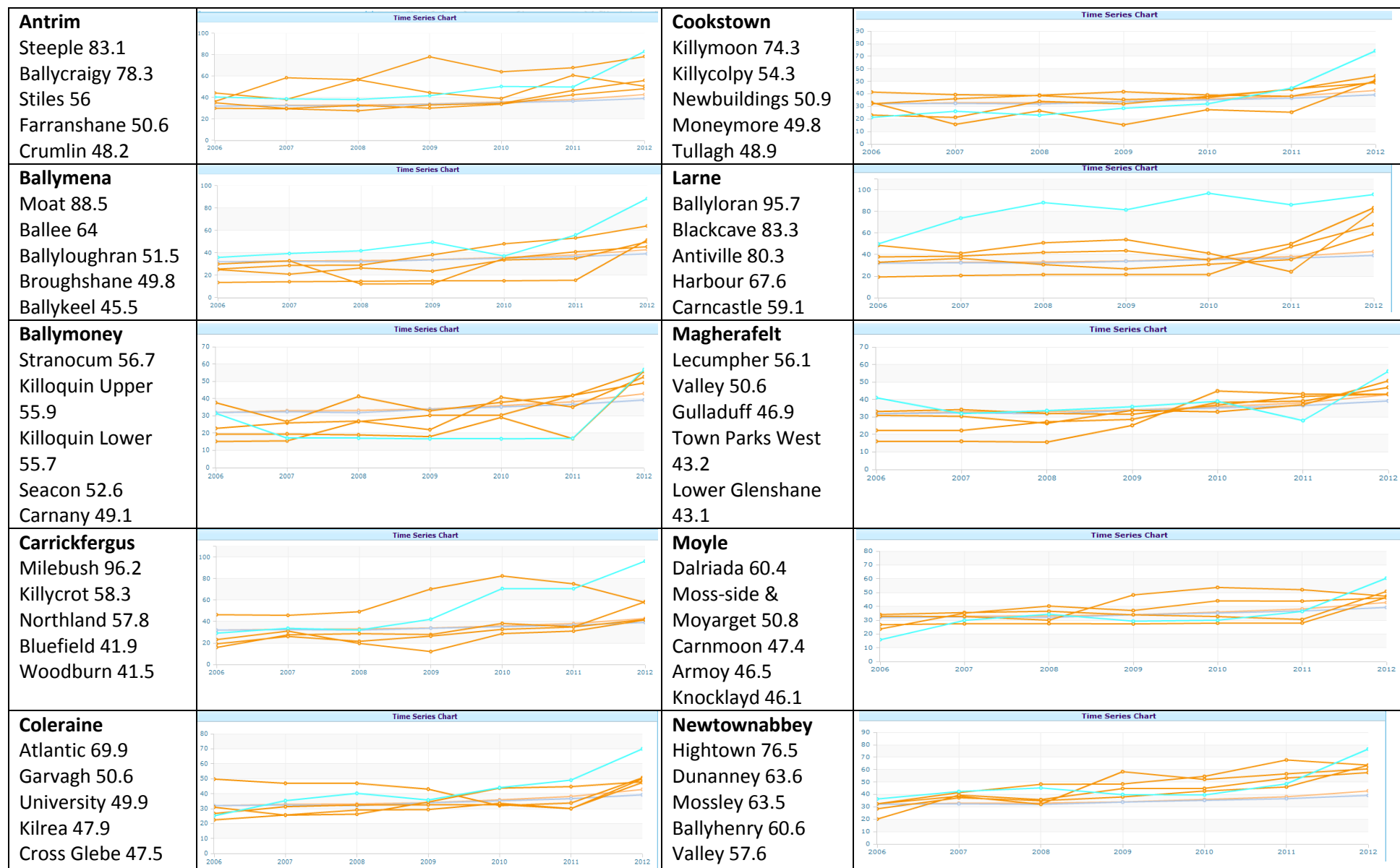

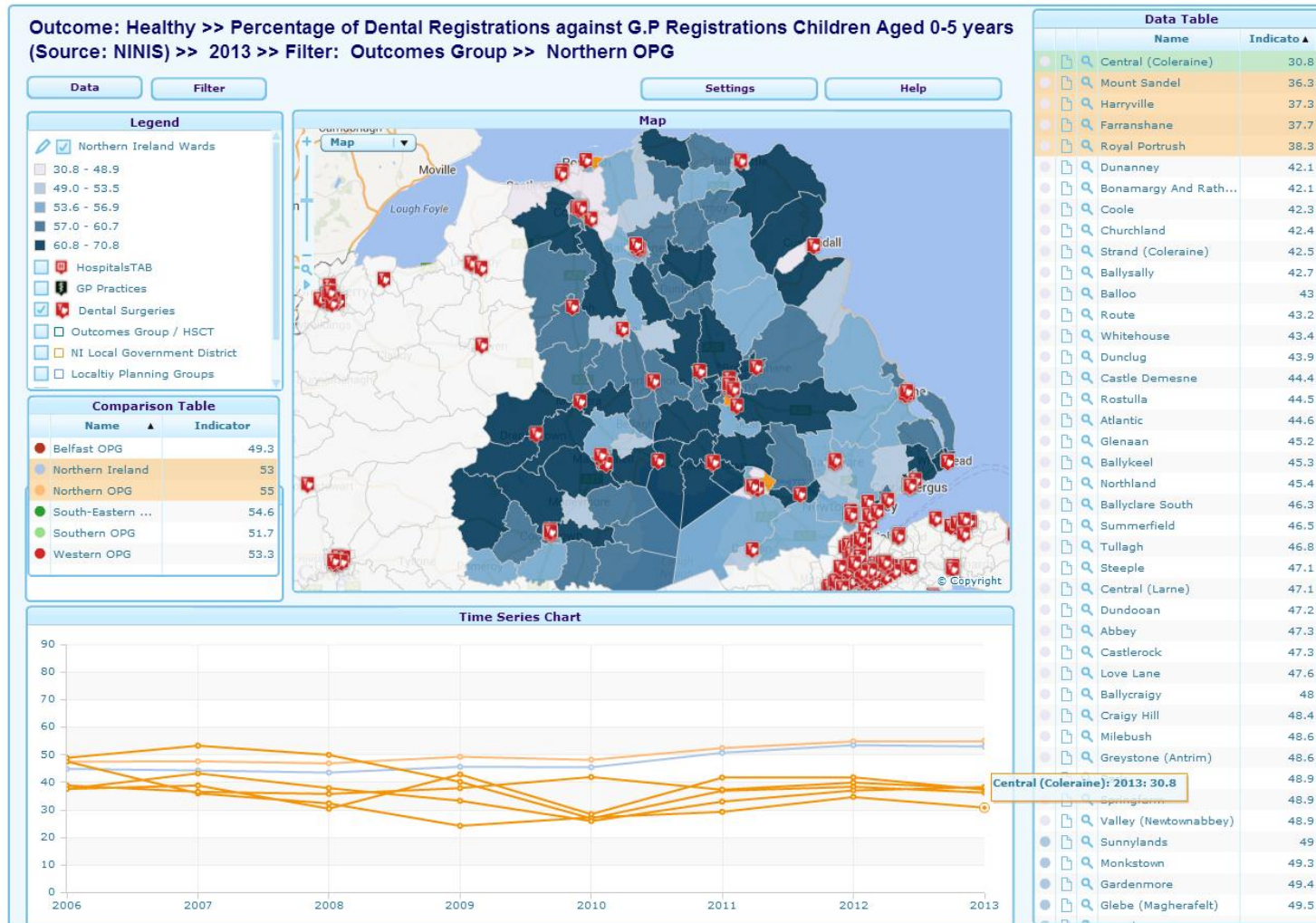

# 0-15 YEAR OLDS IN RECEIPT OF DLA - DEC 2012

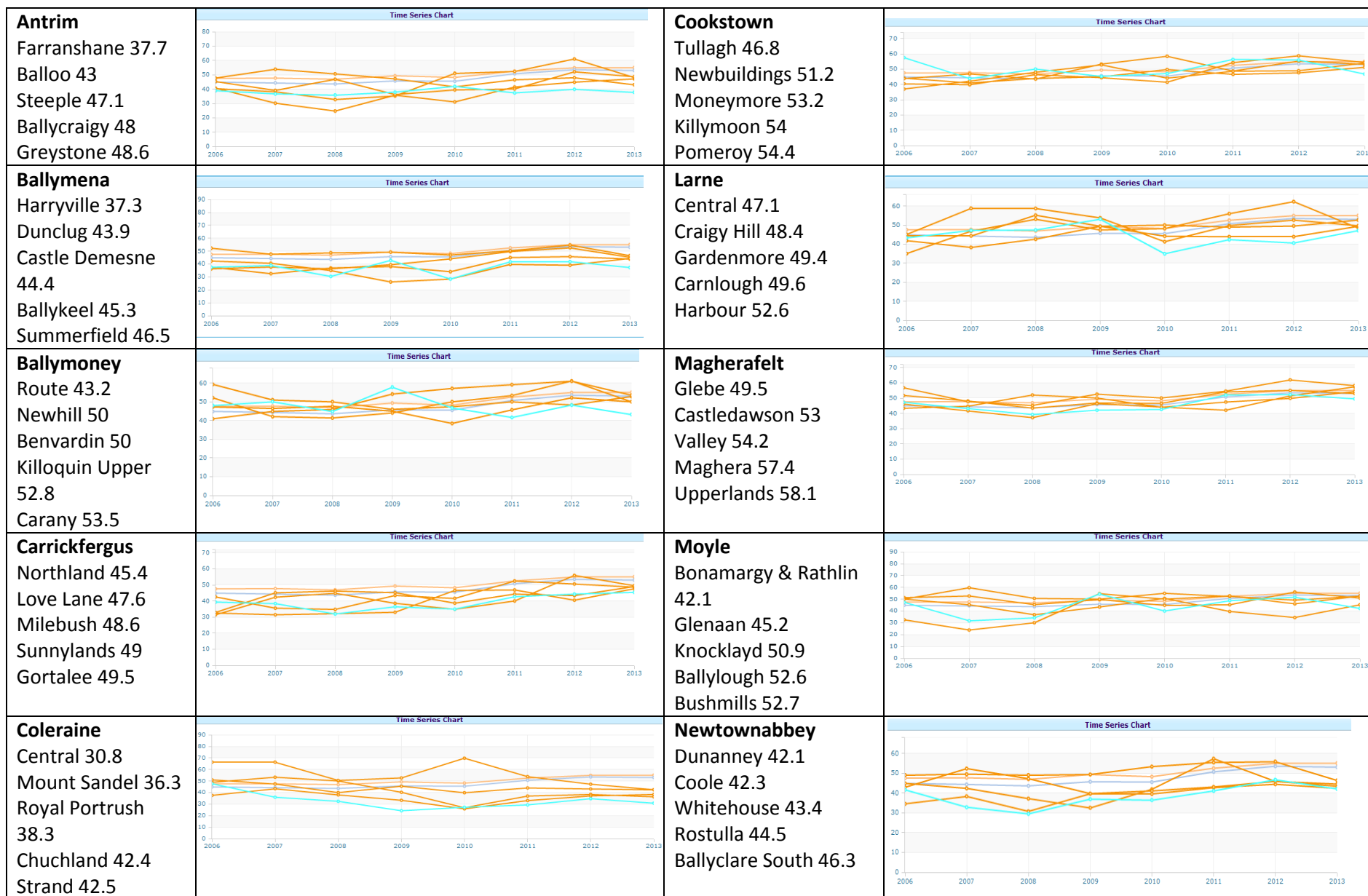

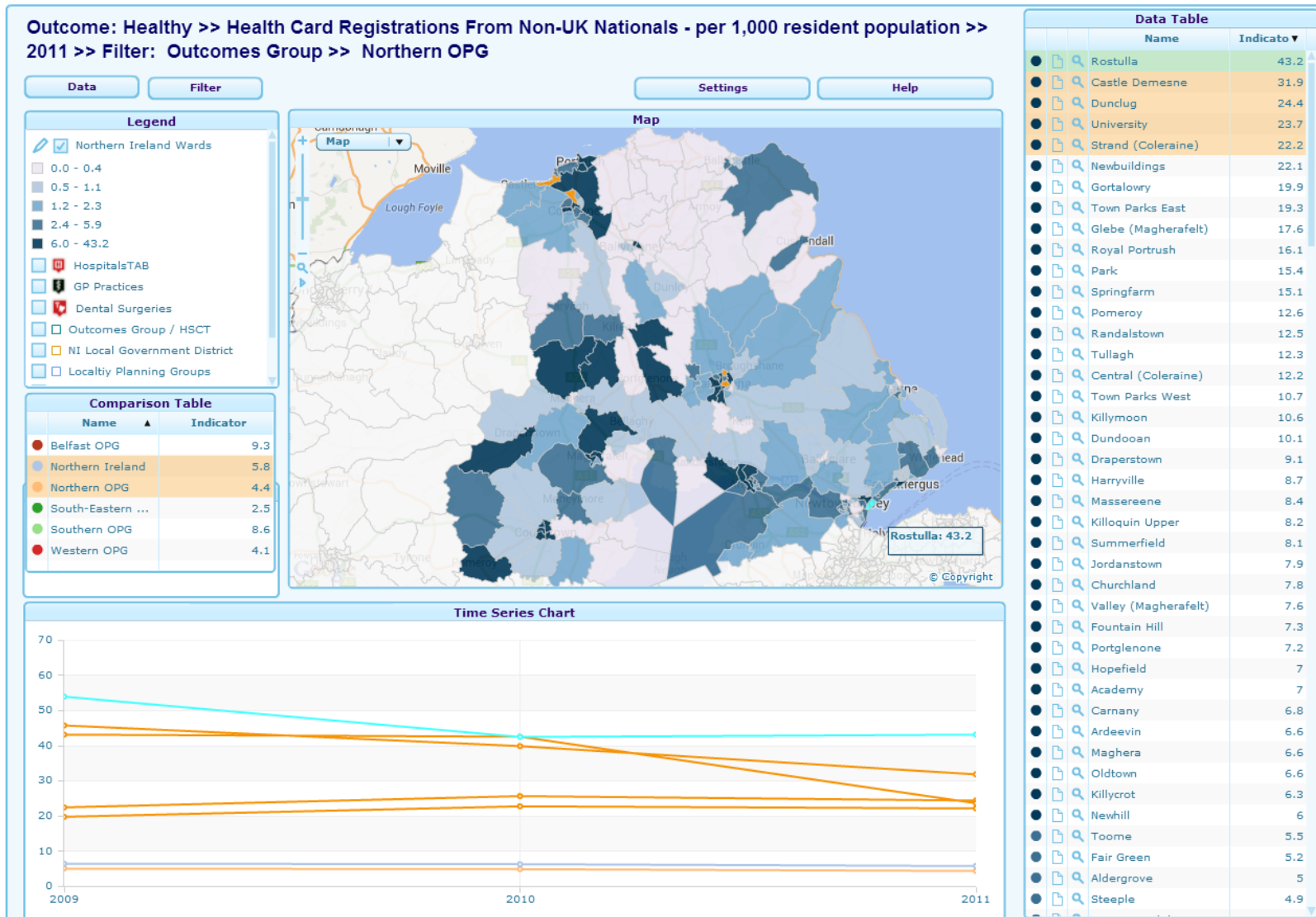

# 0-5 DENTAL REGISTRATIONS - DEC 2013

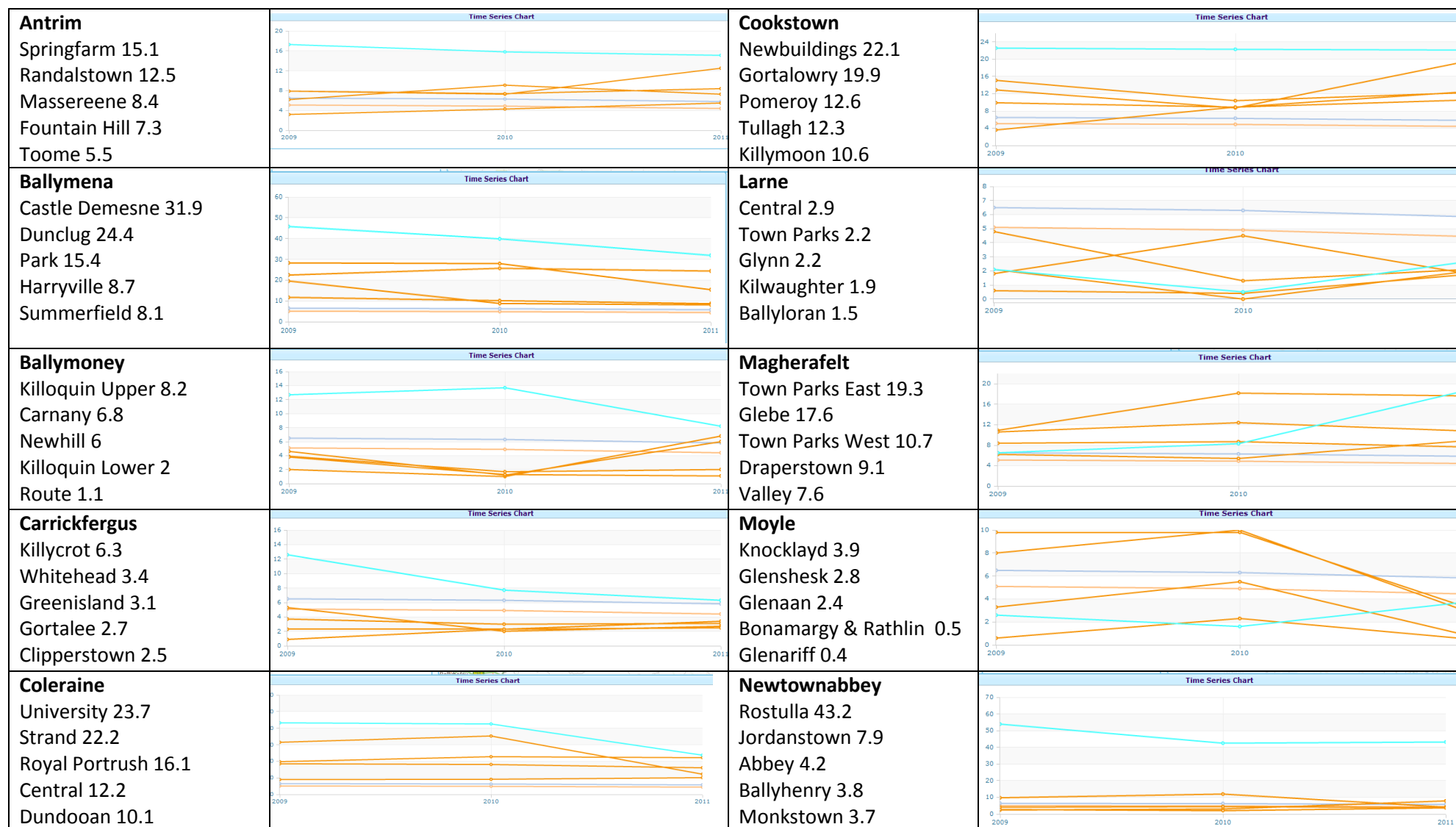

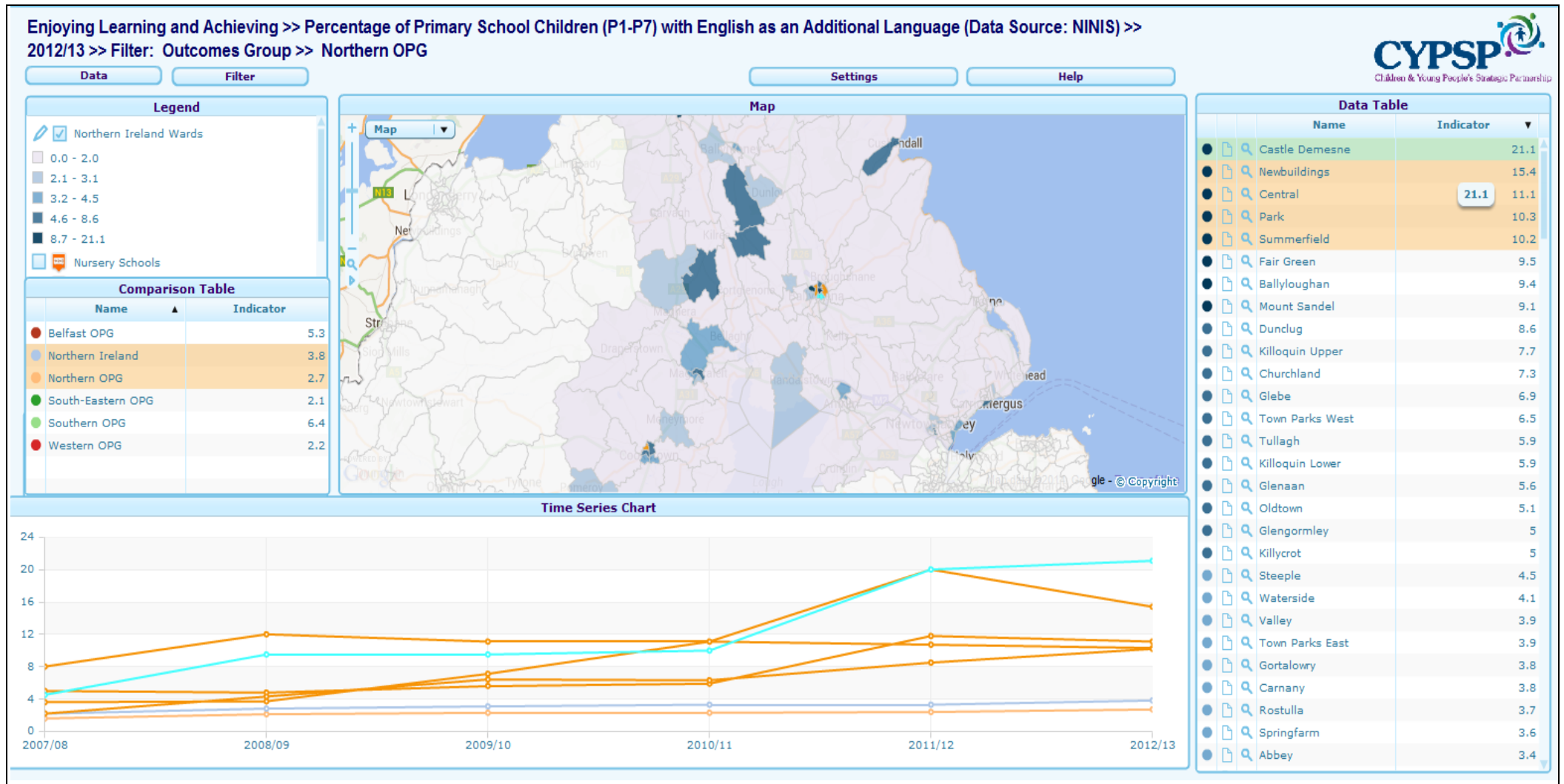

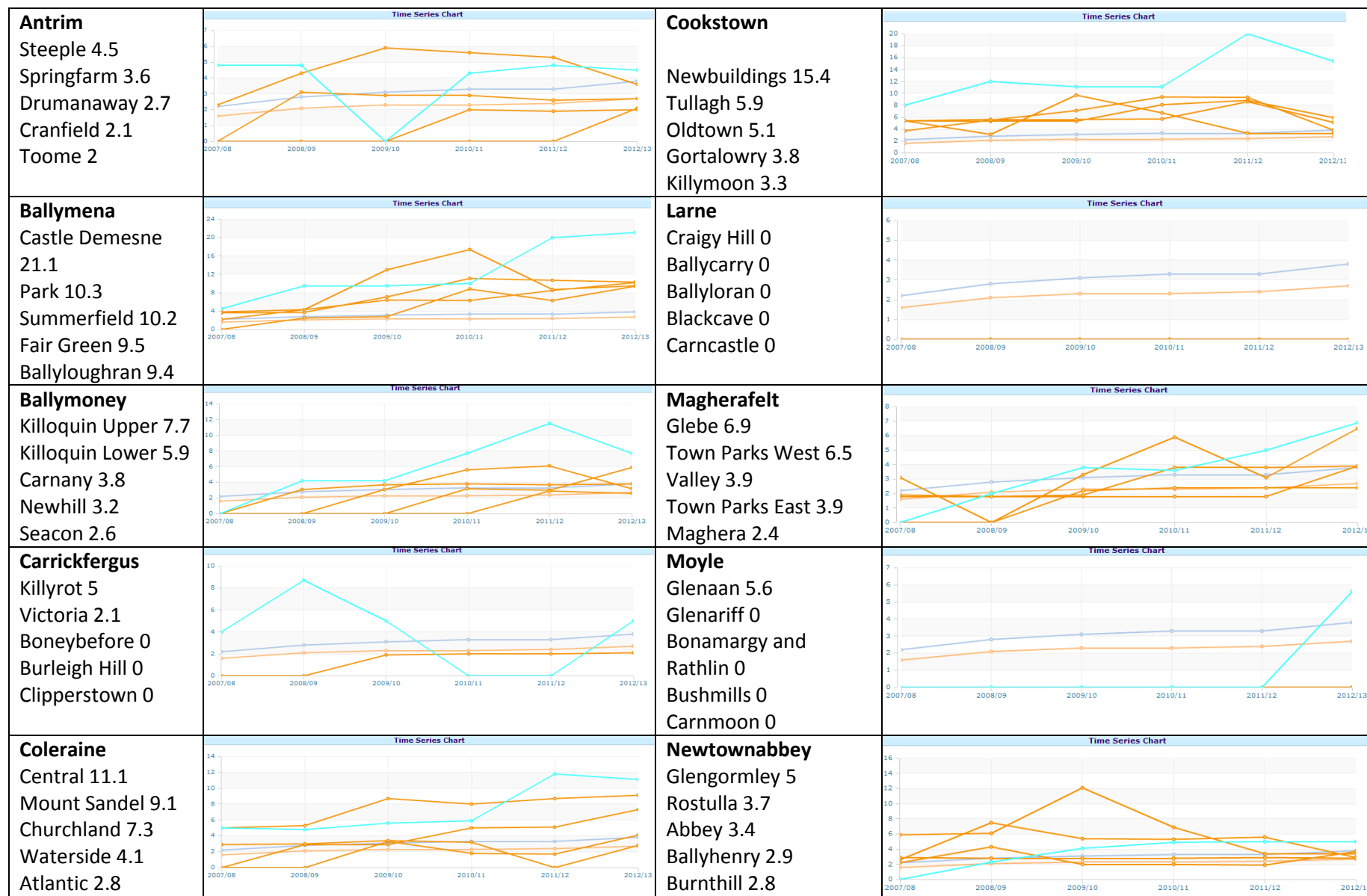

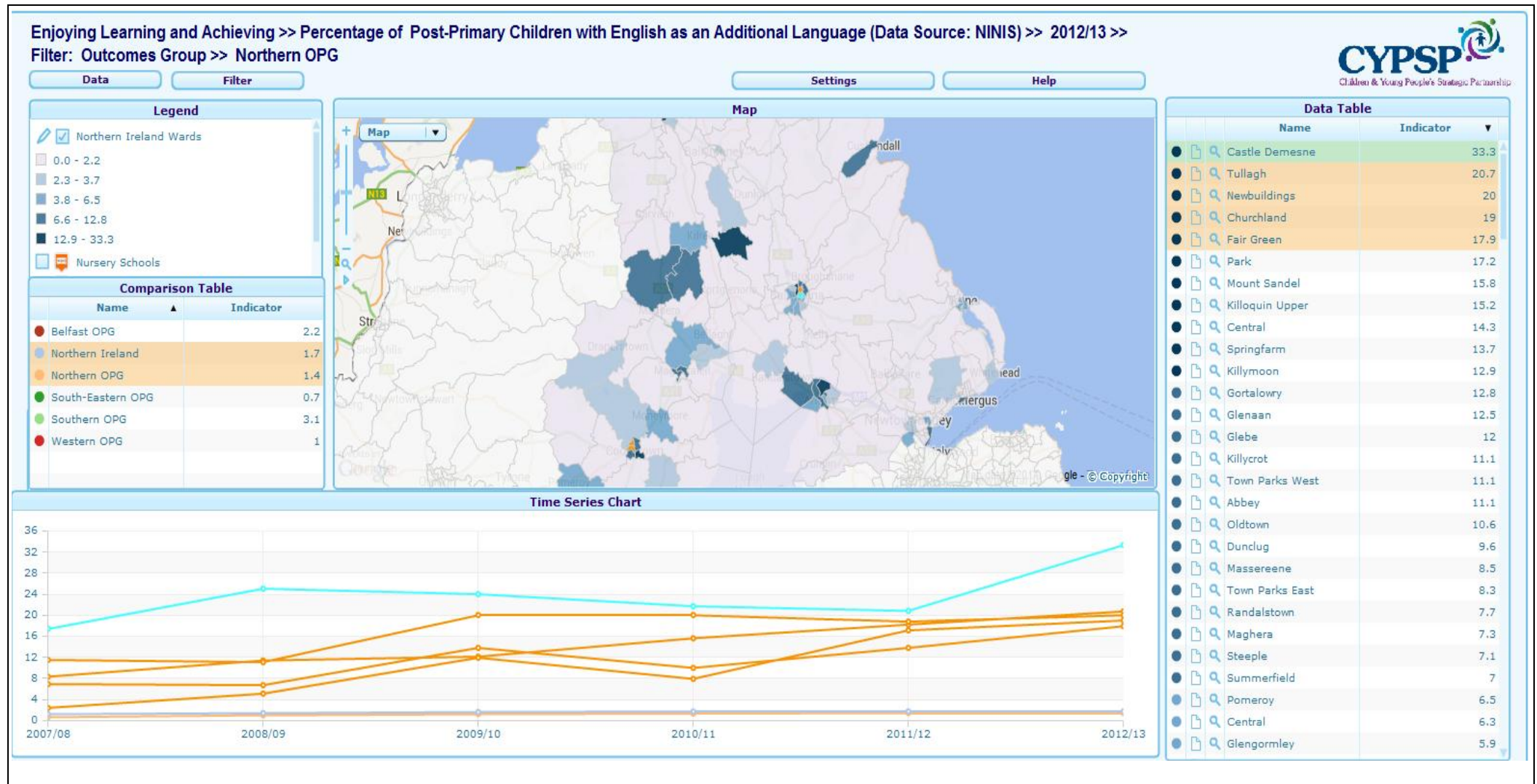

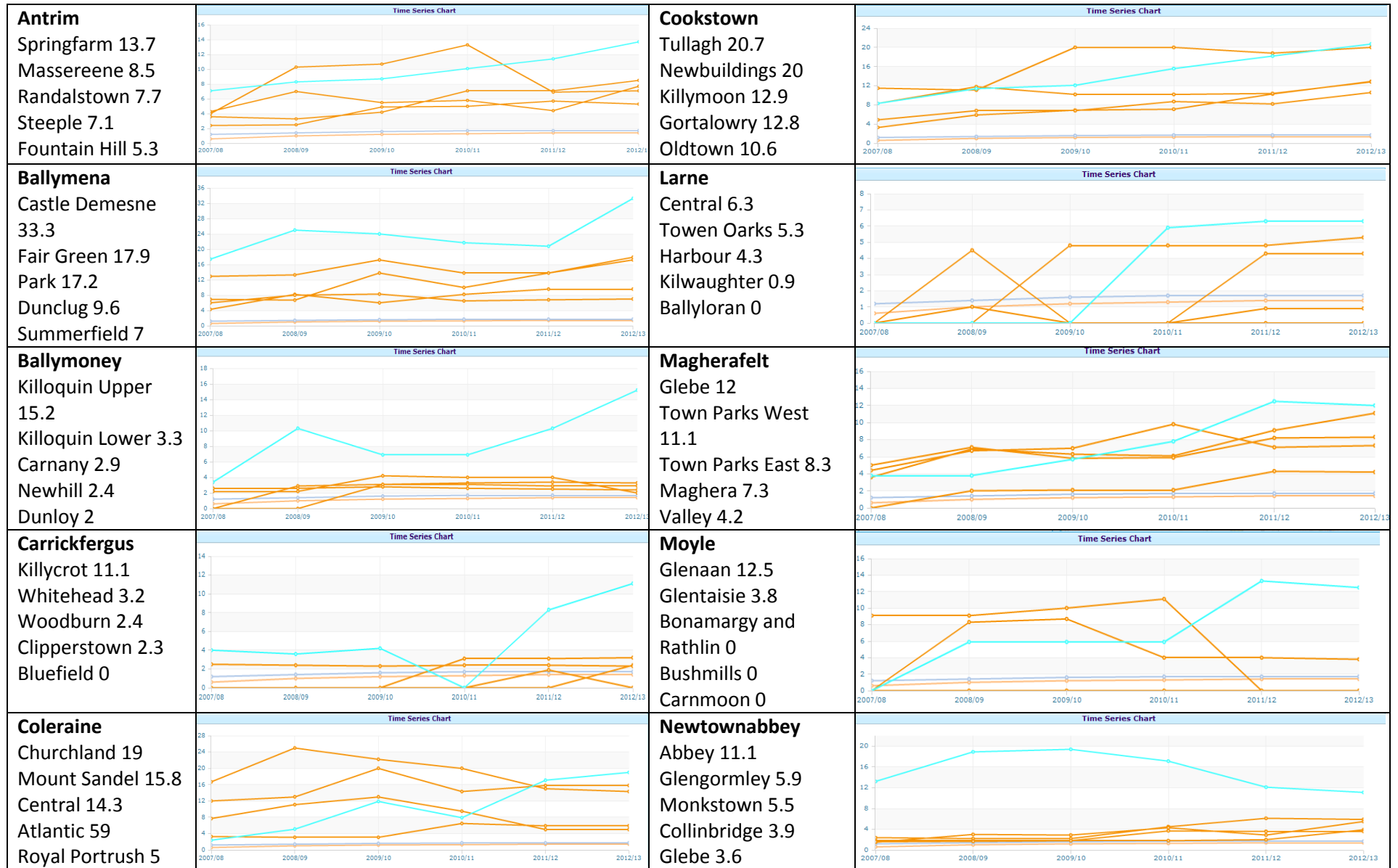

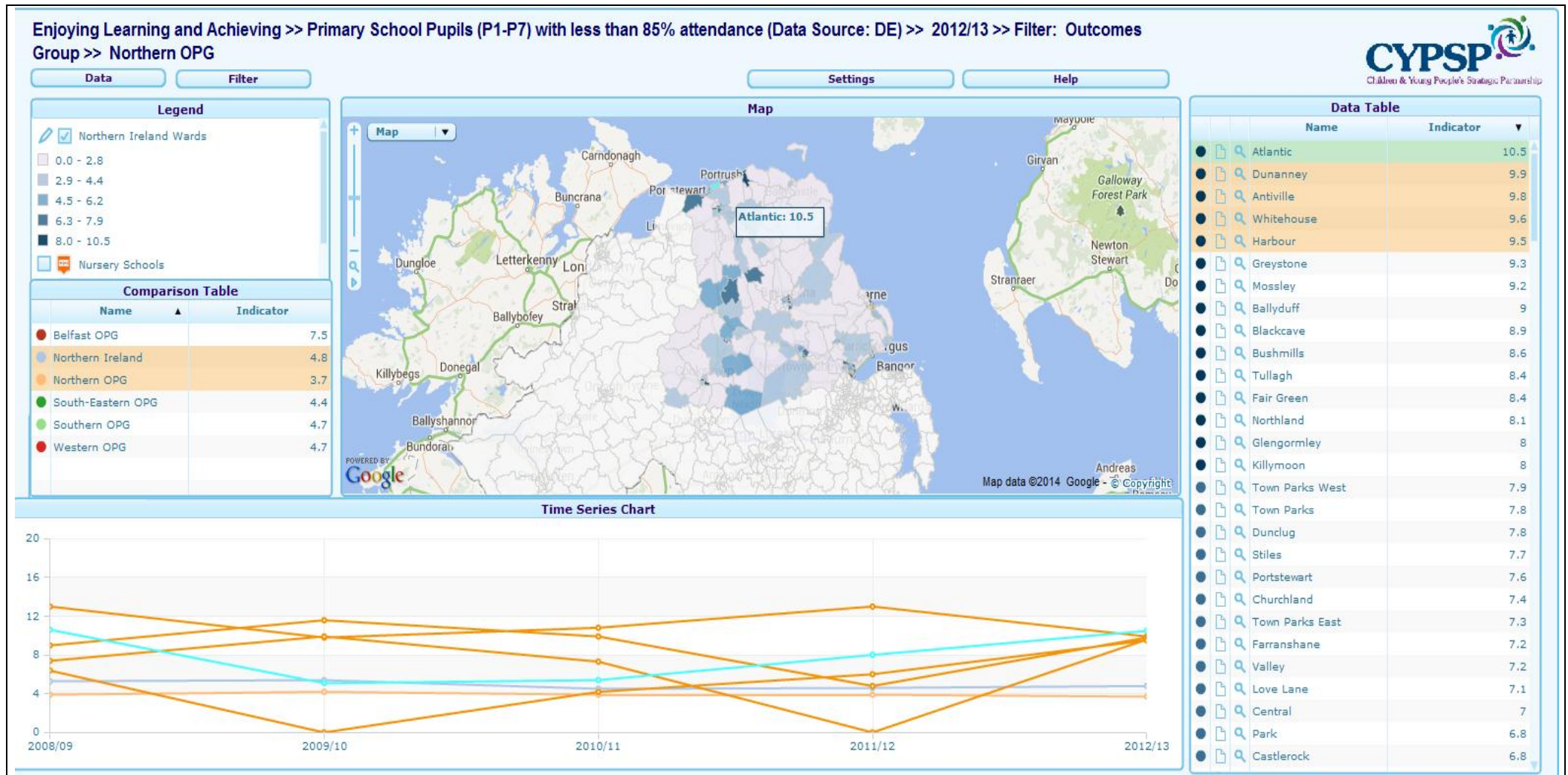

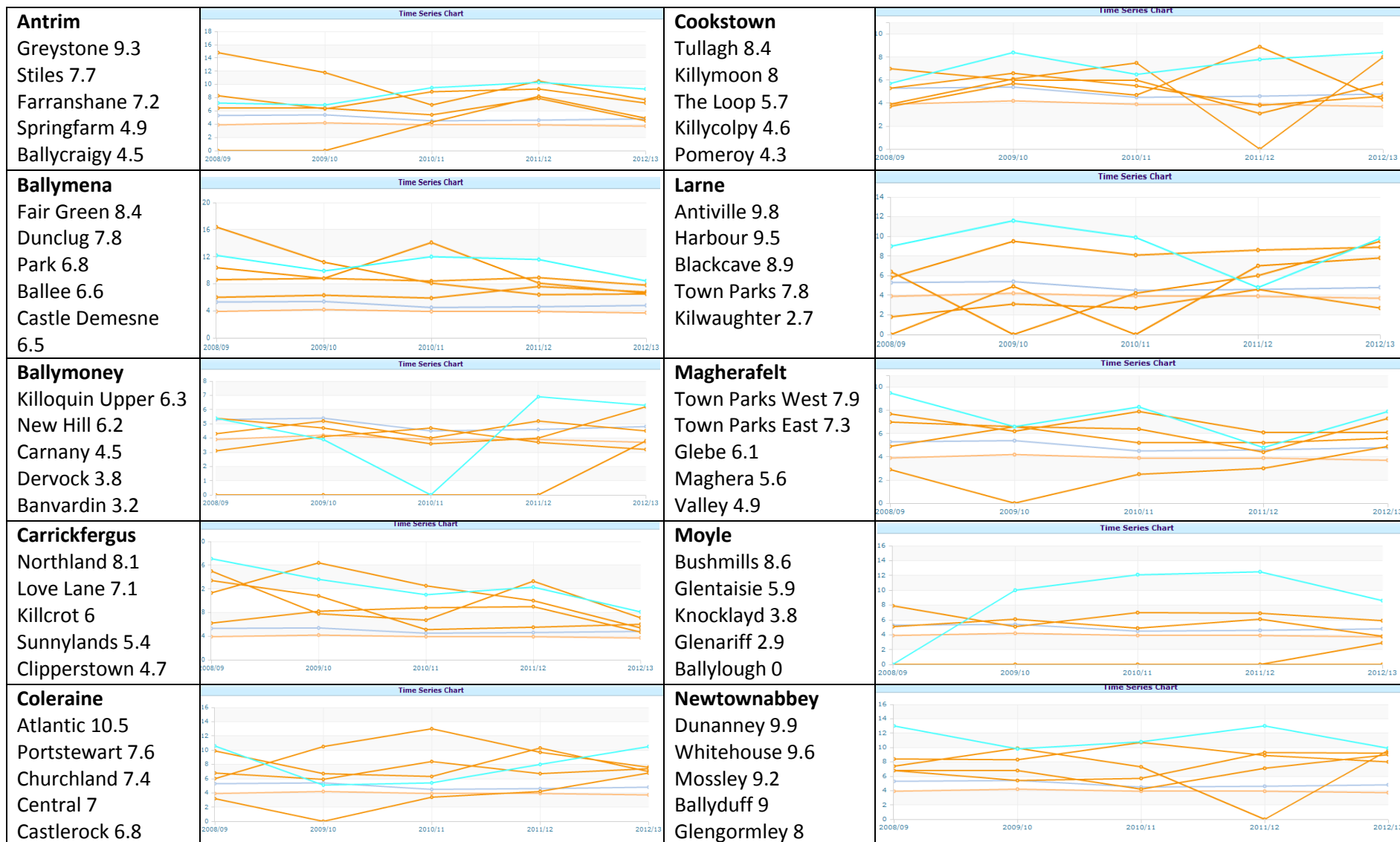

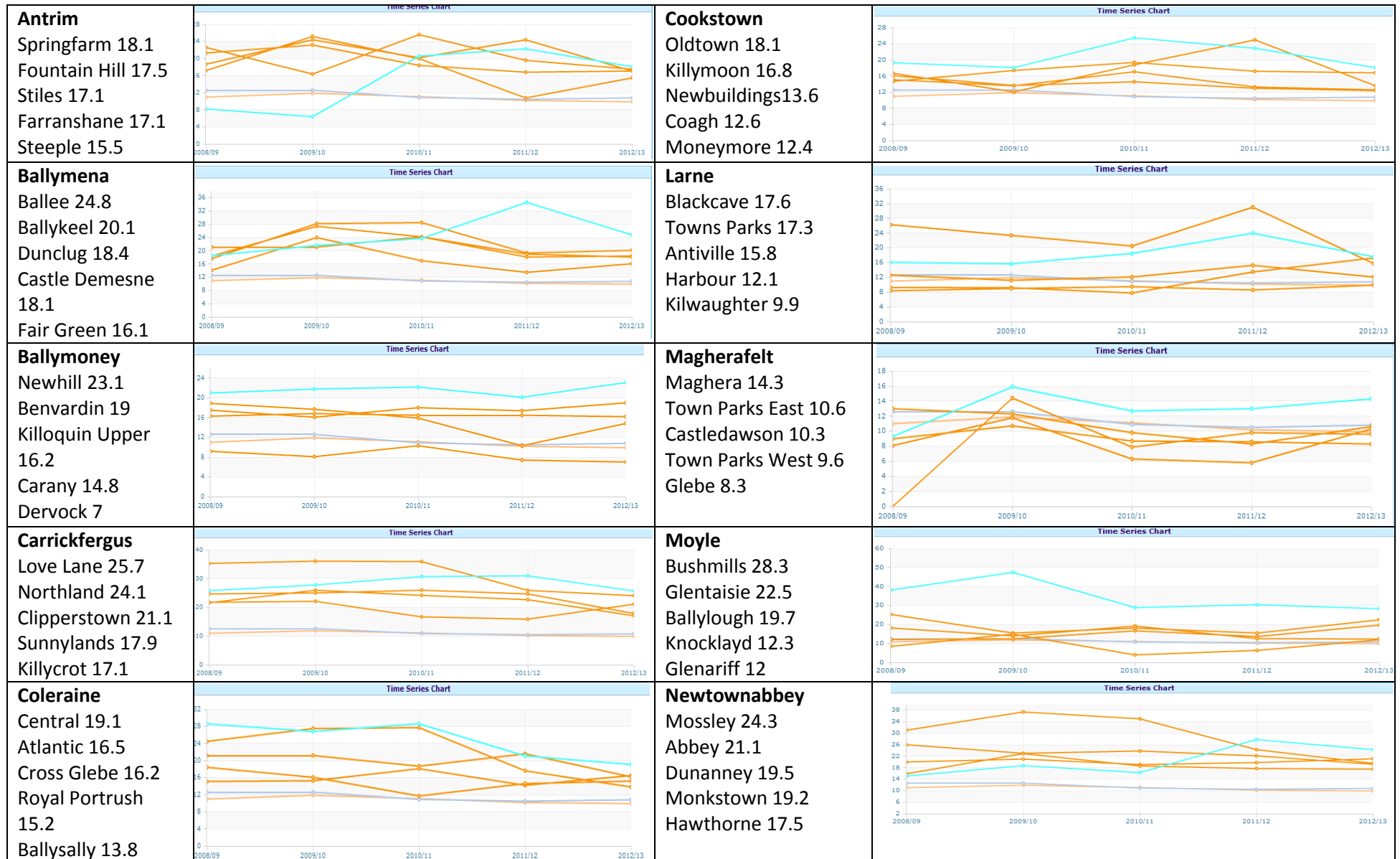

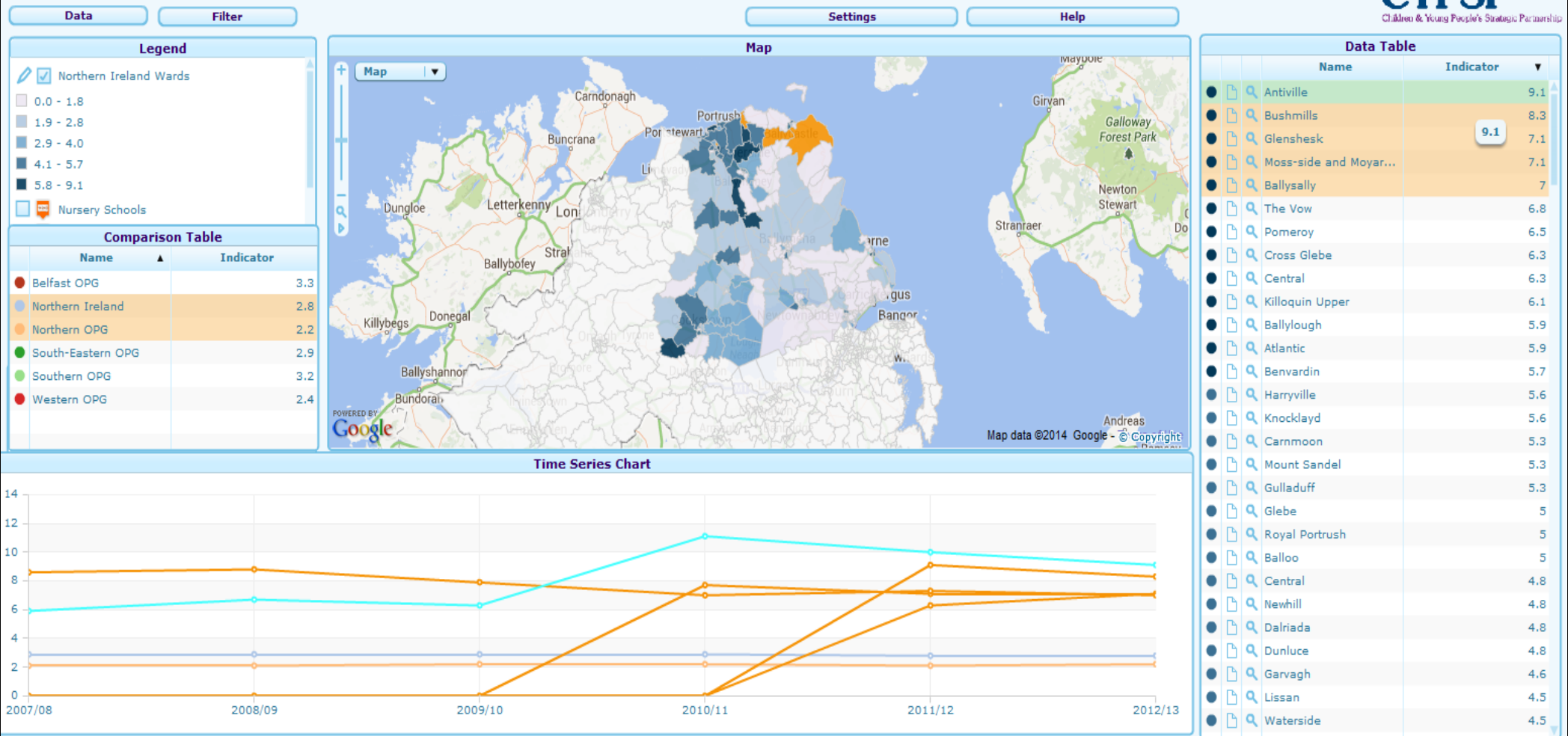


# POST PRIMARY SCHOOL PUPILS WITH LESS THAN 85% ATTENDANCE AT 2012/13



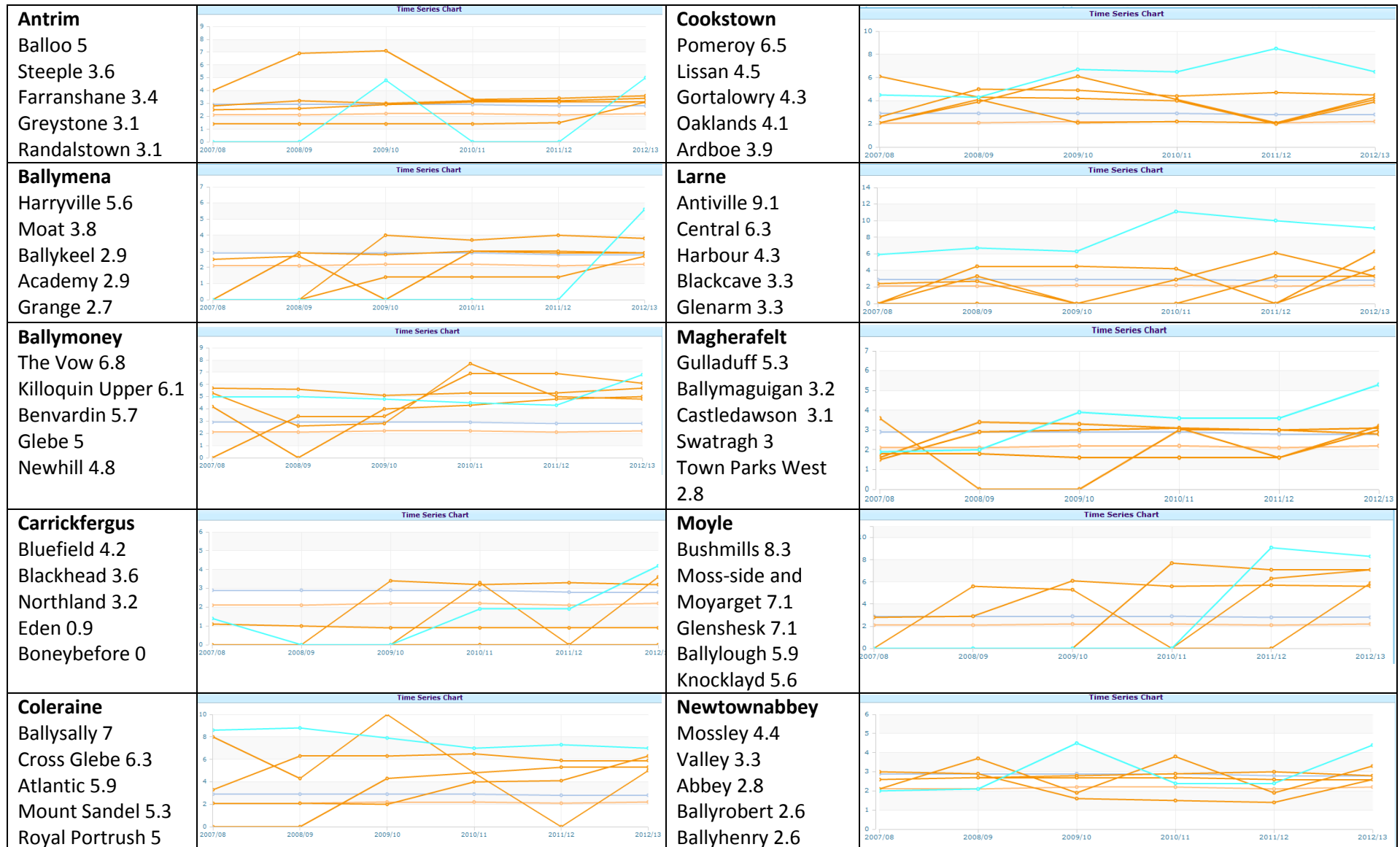

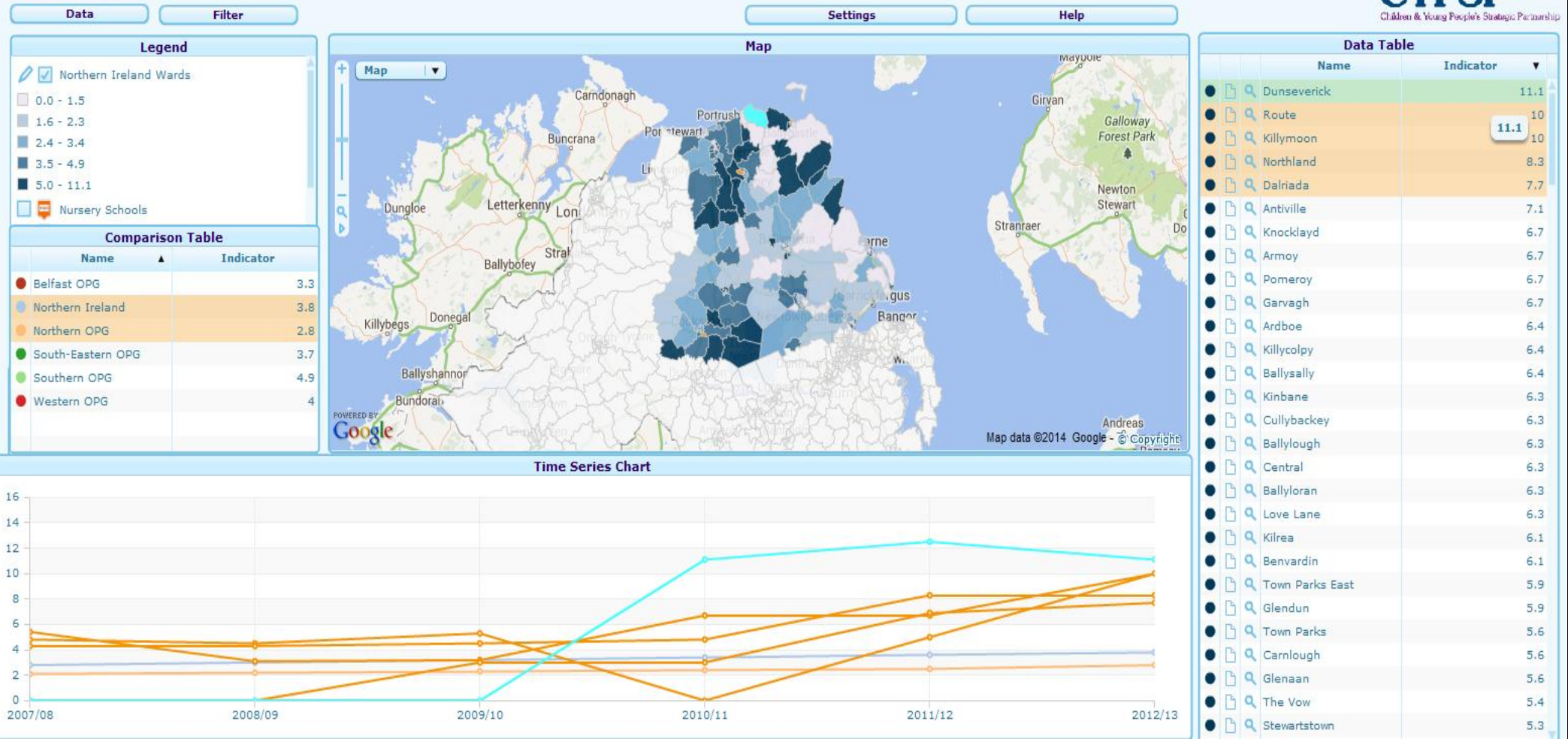

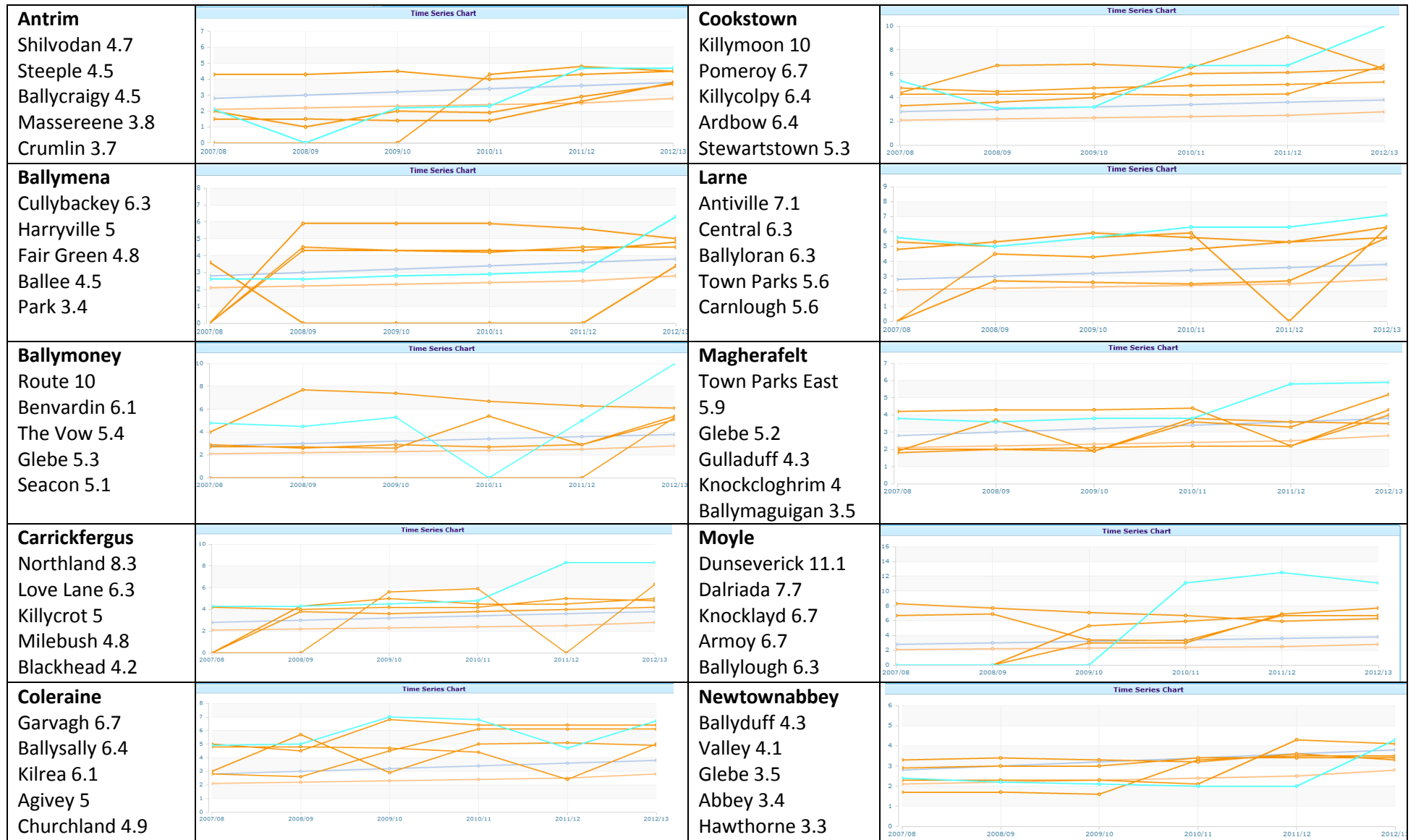

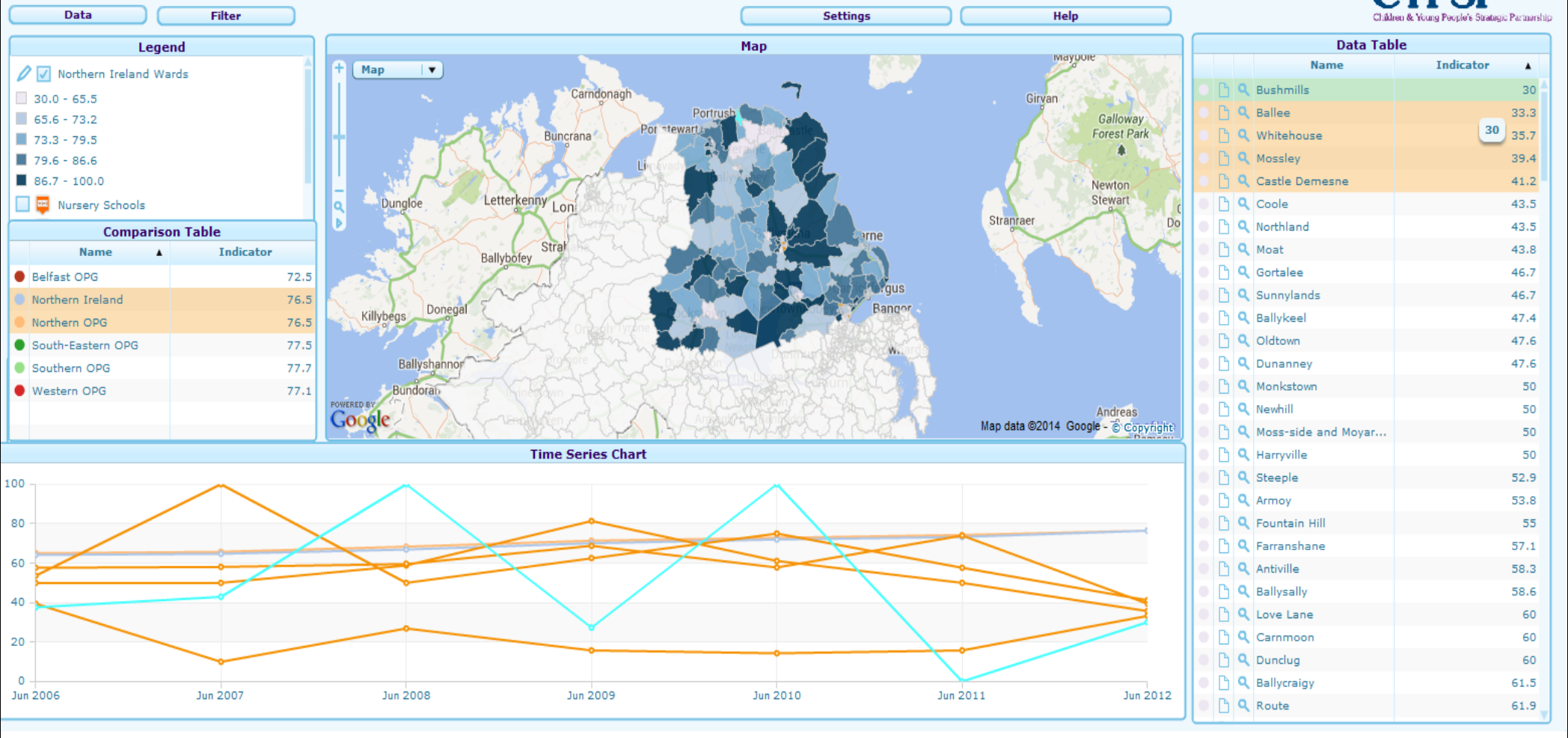


# PERCENTAGE OF POST-PRIMARY SCHOOL PUPILS STATEMENTED AT 2012/13

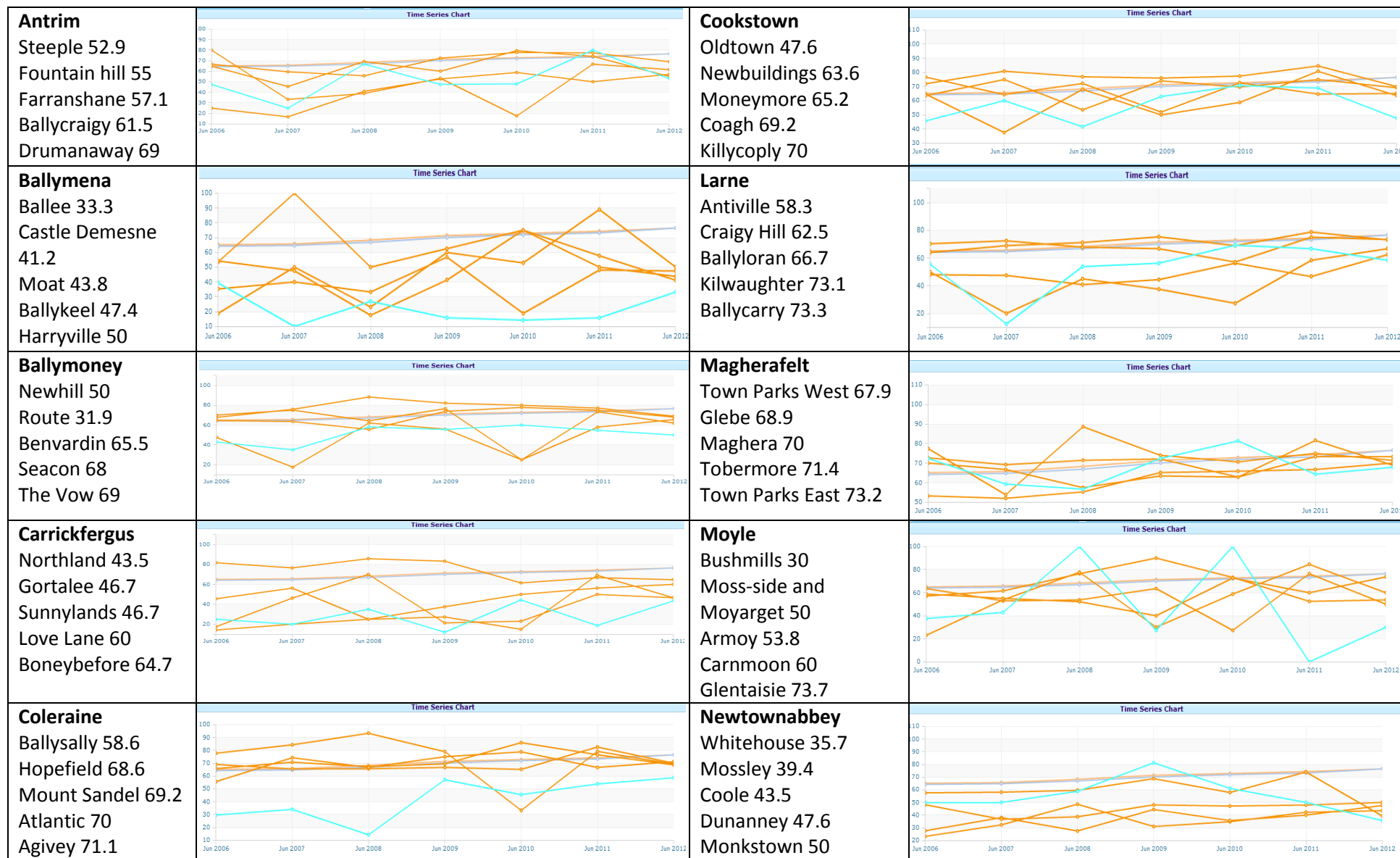

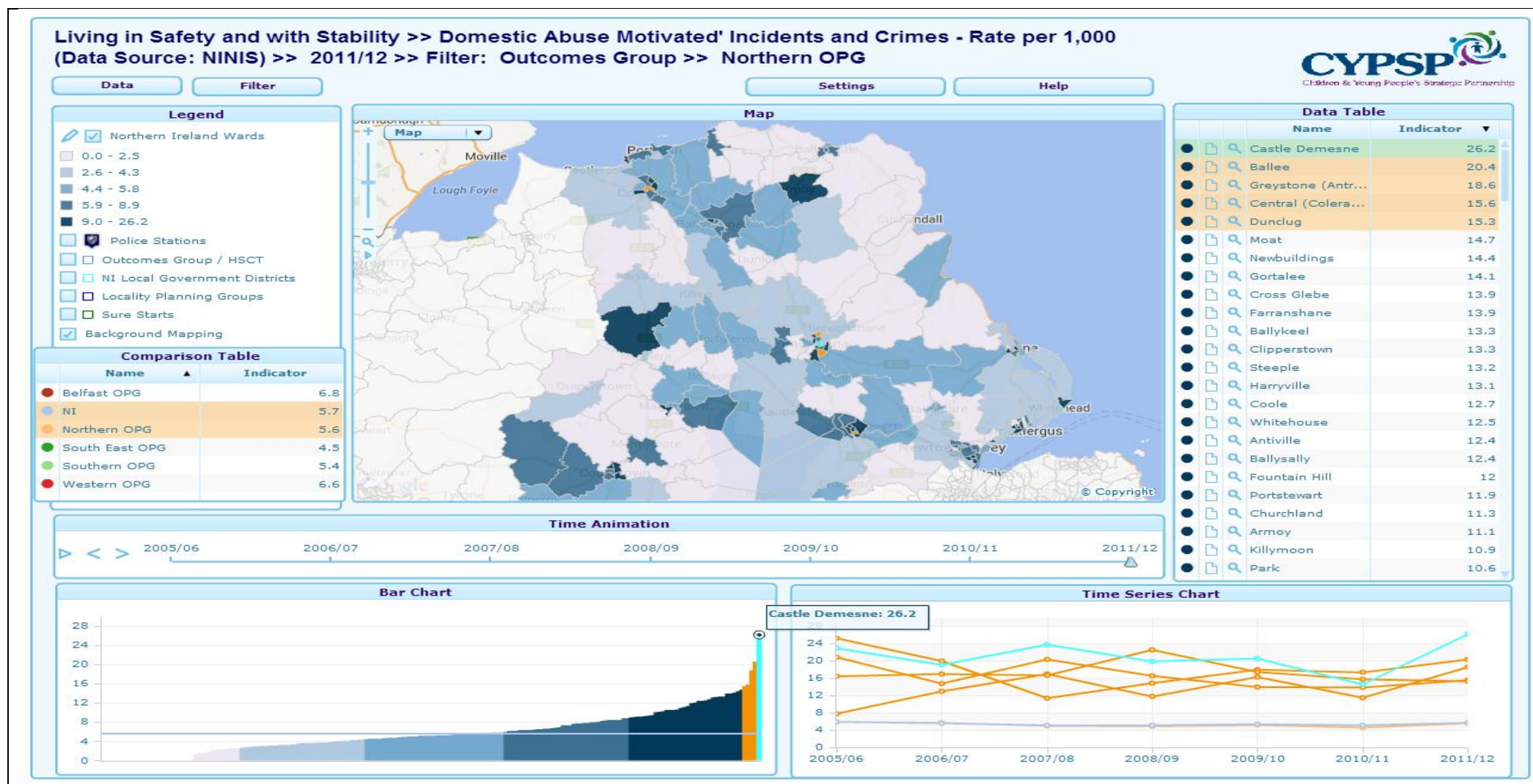

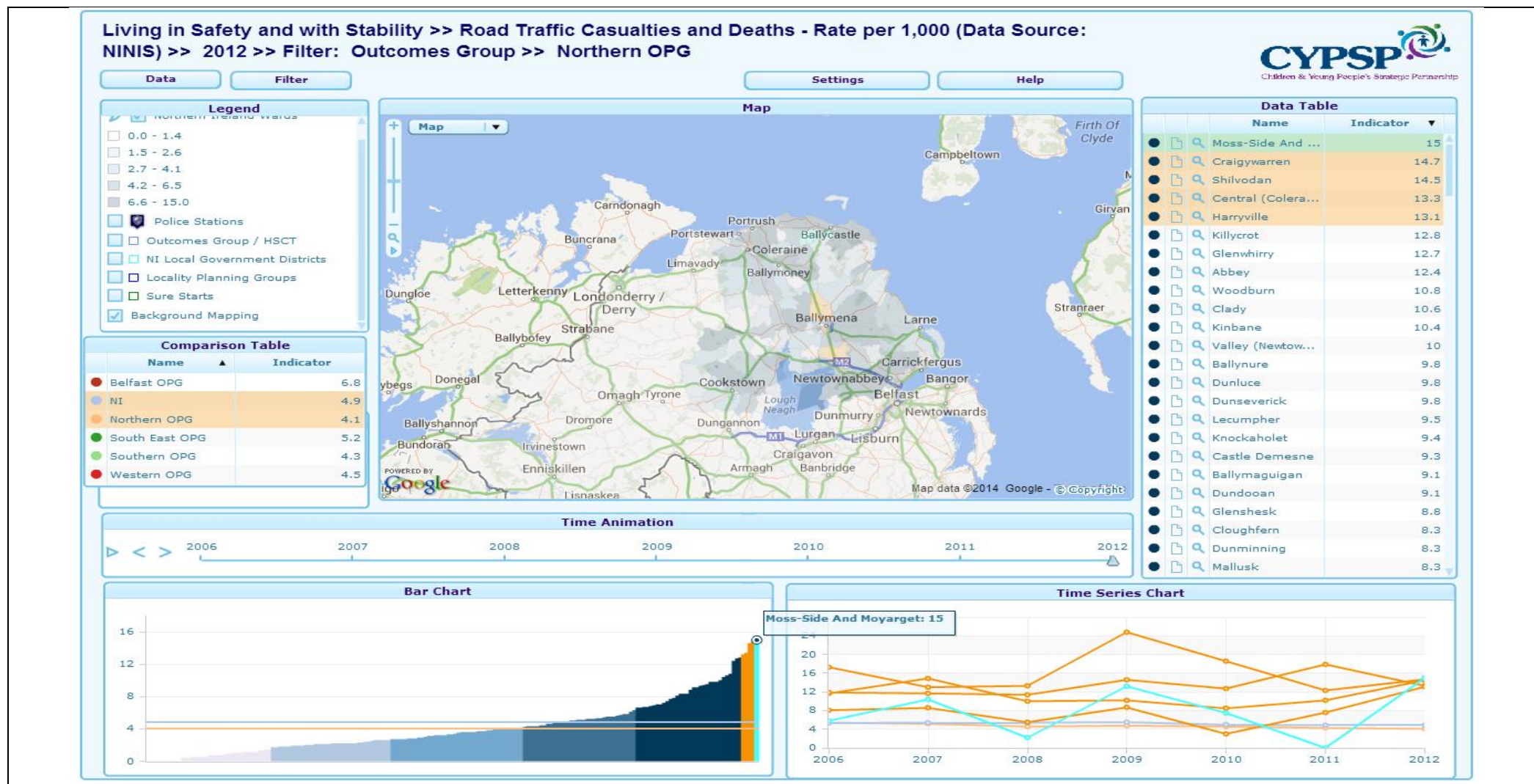

# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR INCIDENTS 2012/13



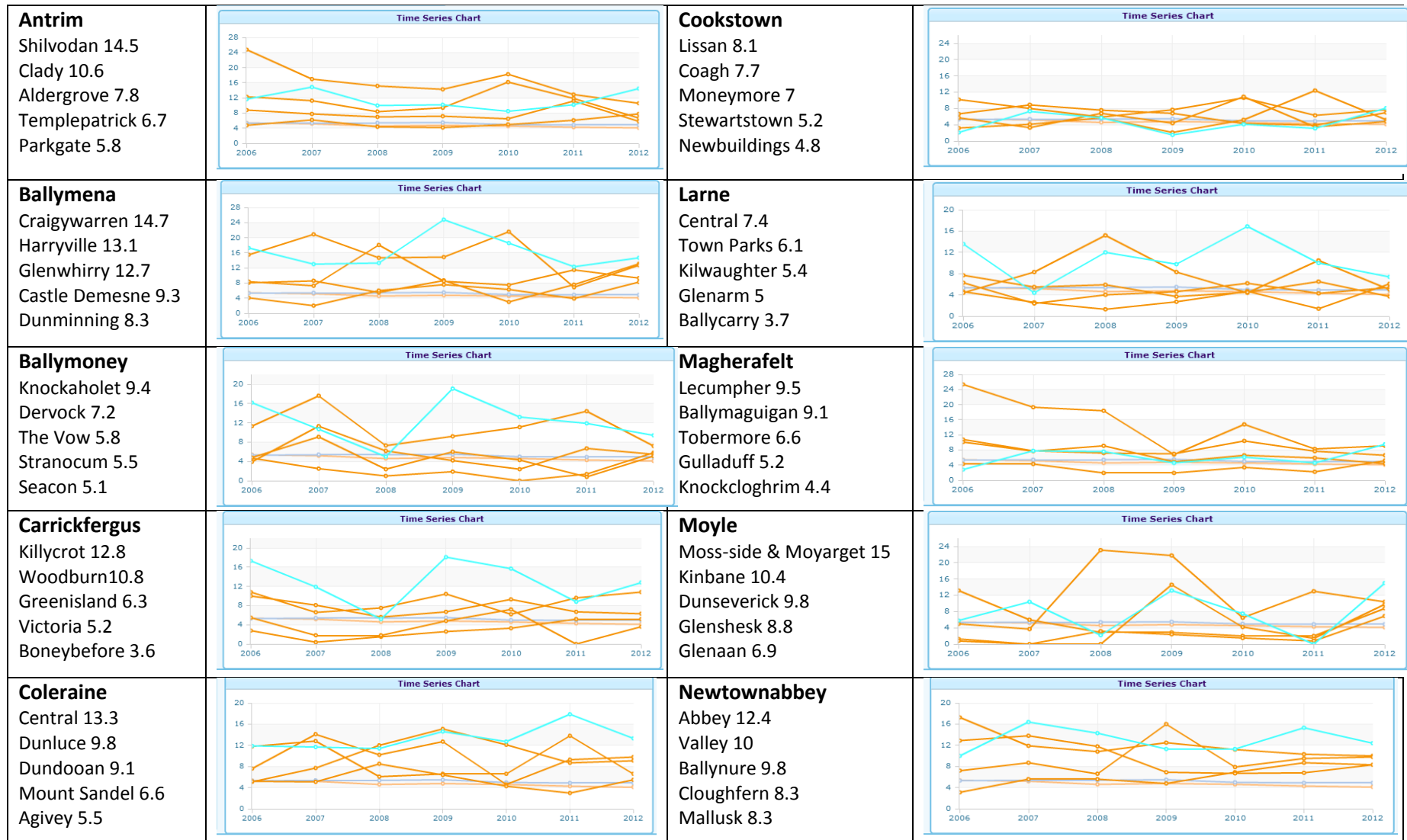

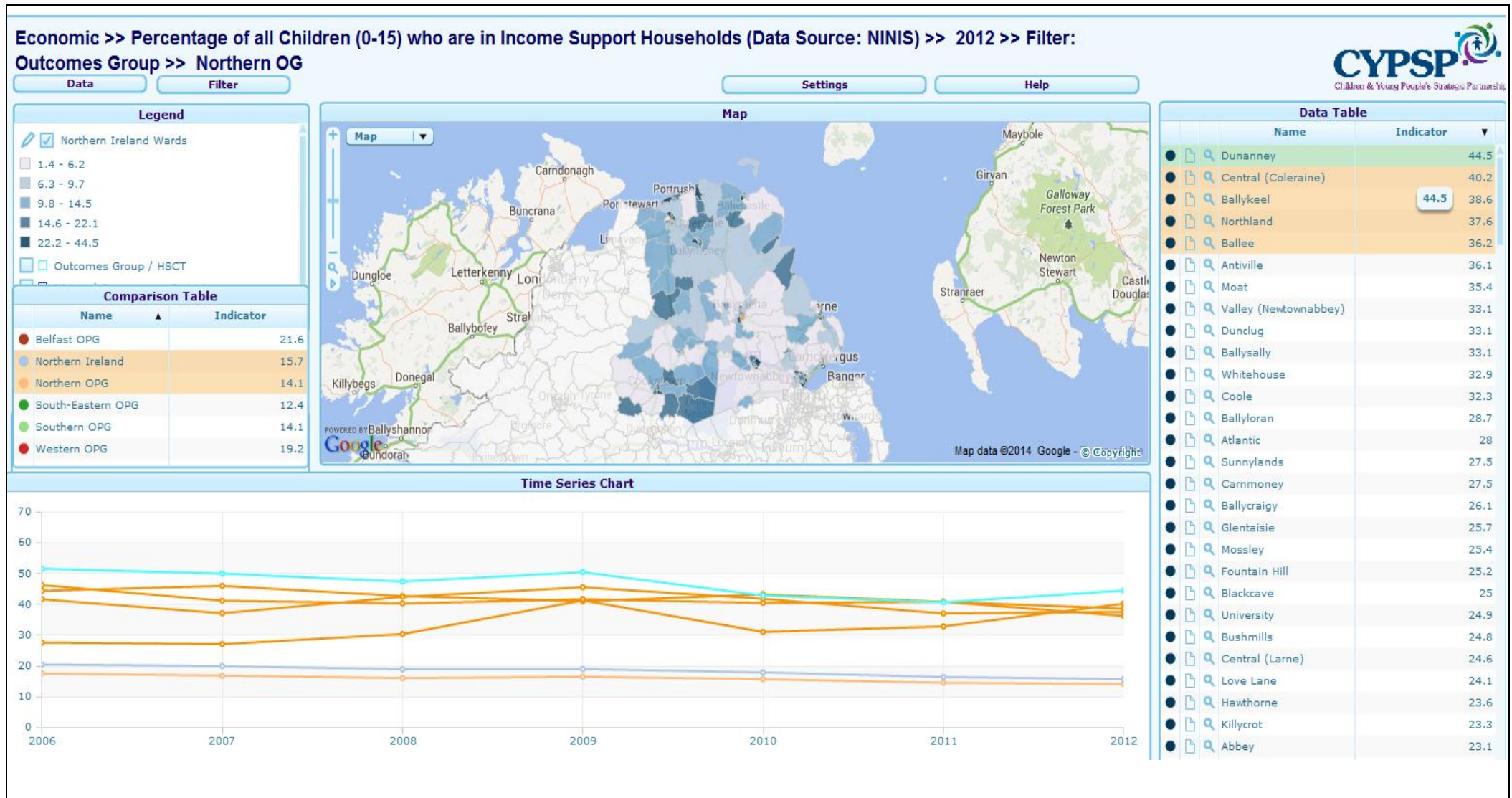

## ROAD TRAFFIC CASUALTIES DEC 2012



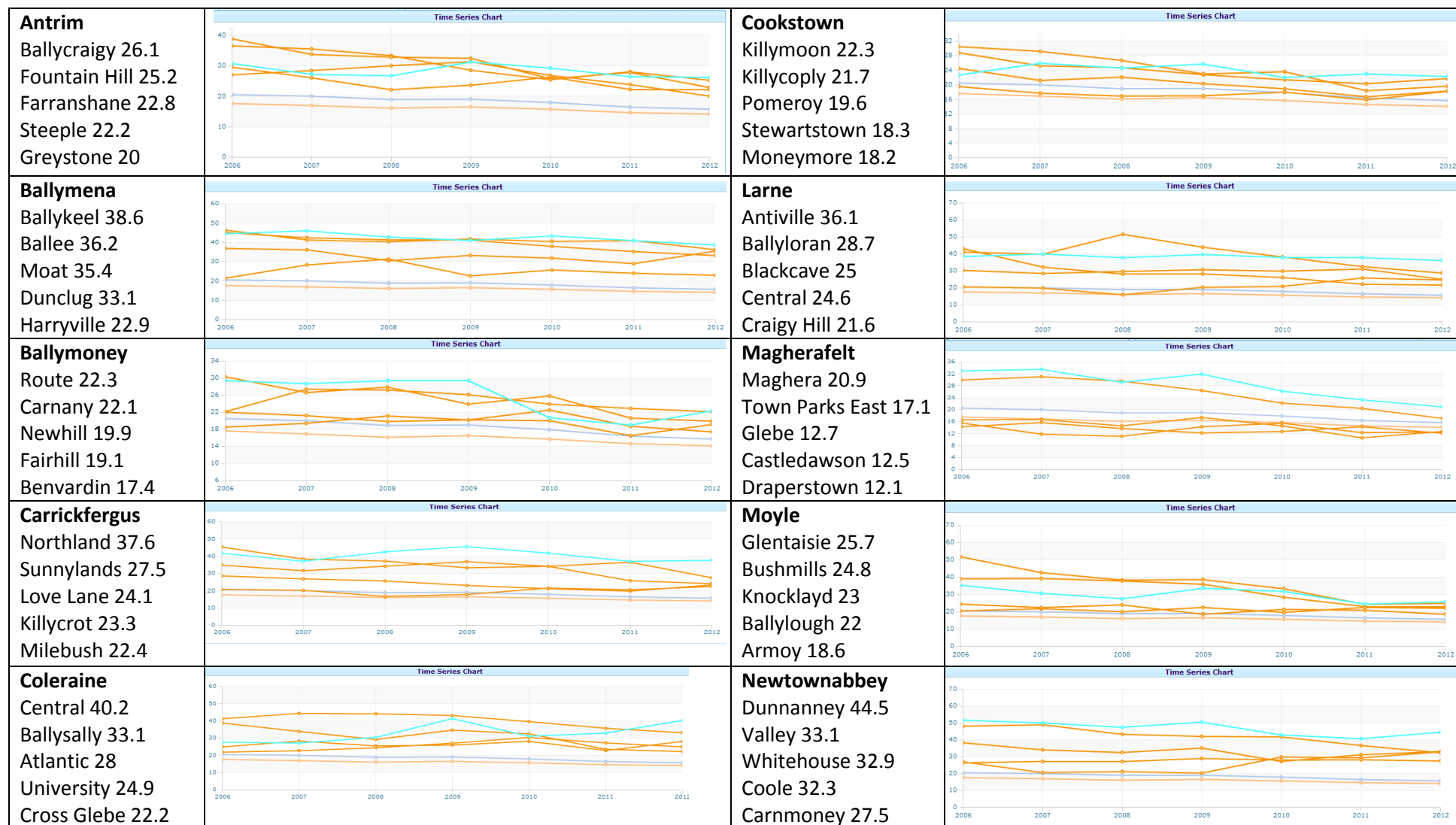

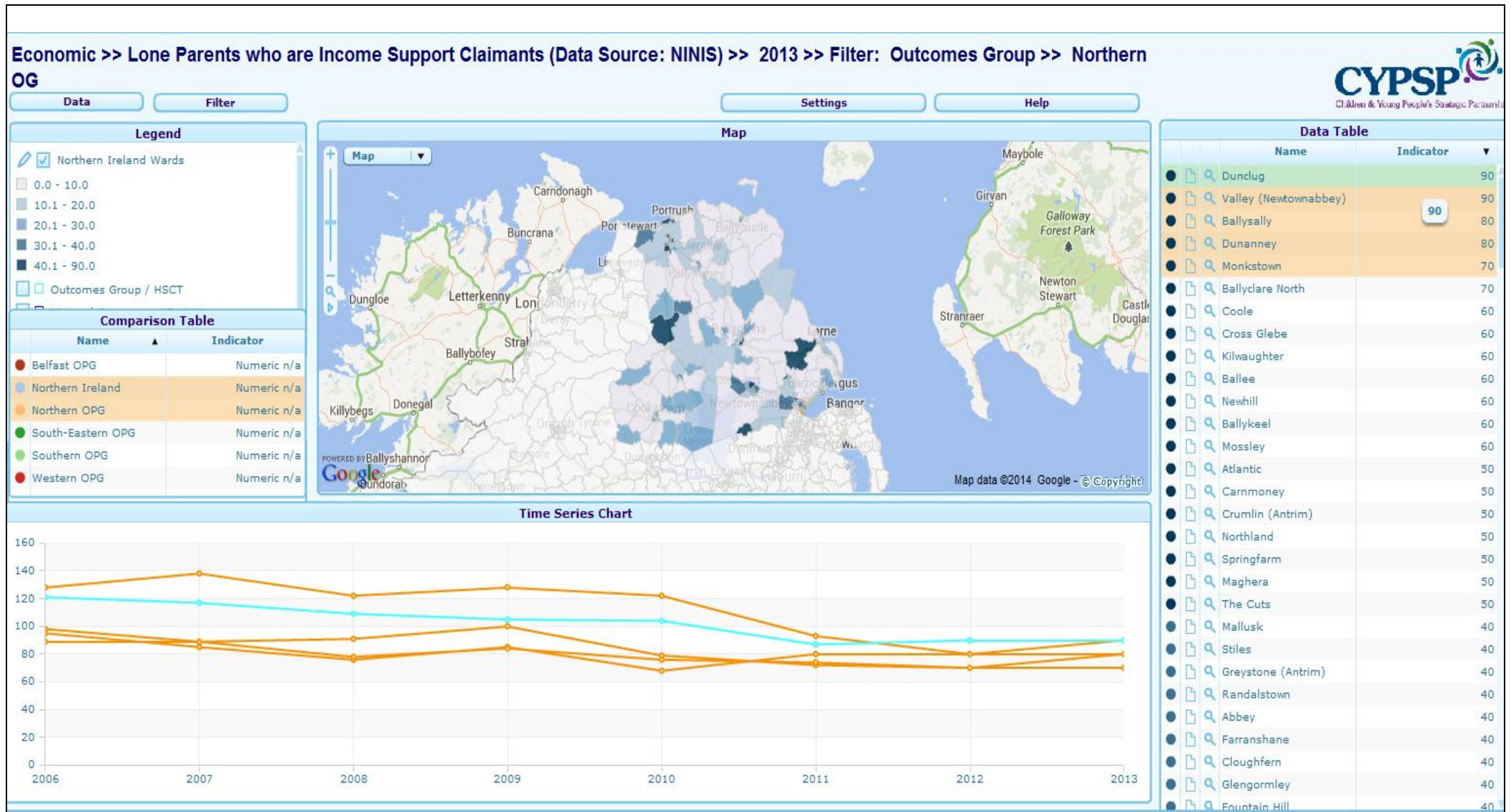

# PERCENTAGE OF CHILDREN AGED 0-15 WHO ARE IN INCOME SUPPORT HOUSEHOLDS DEC 2012



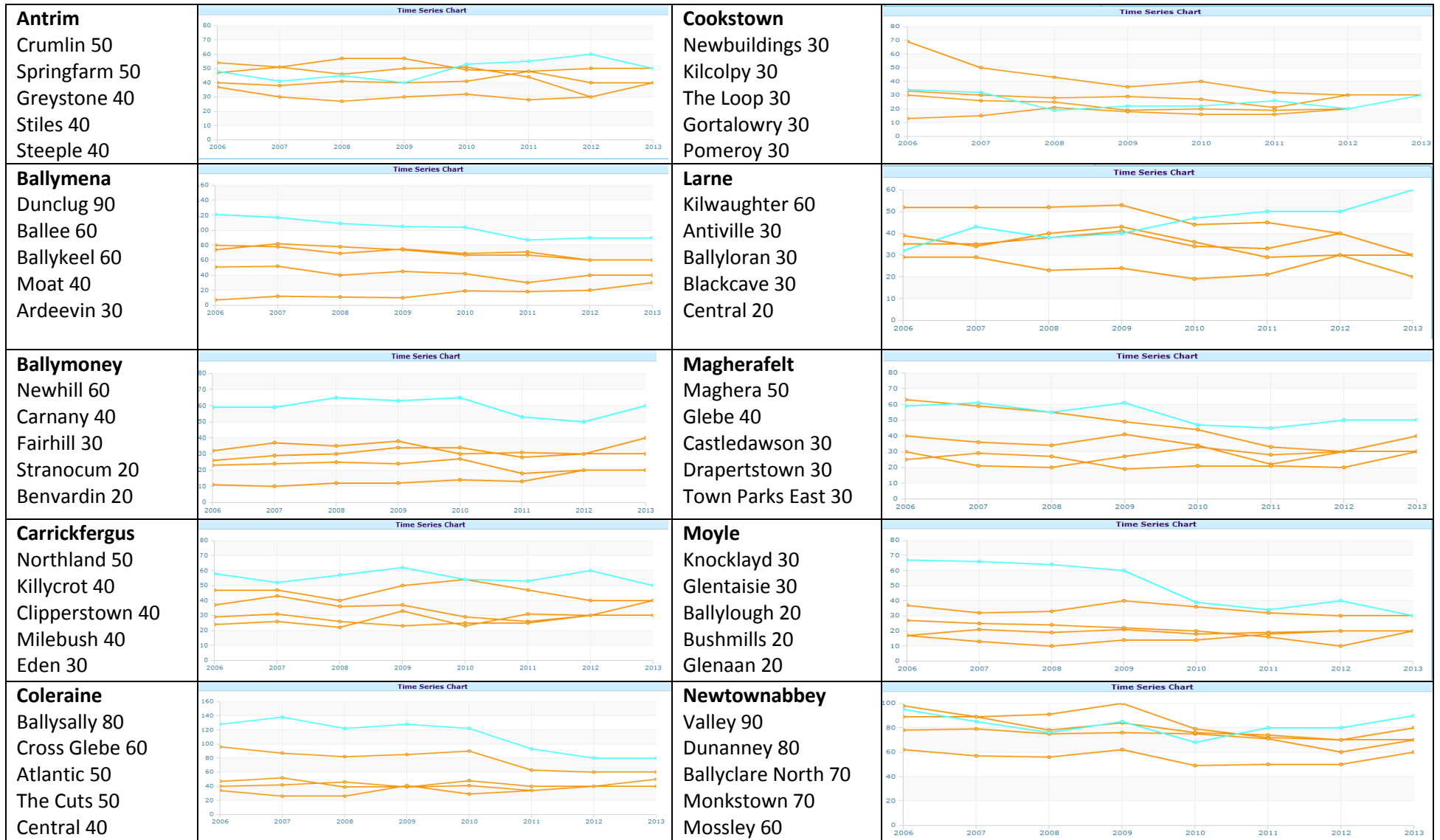

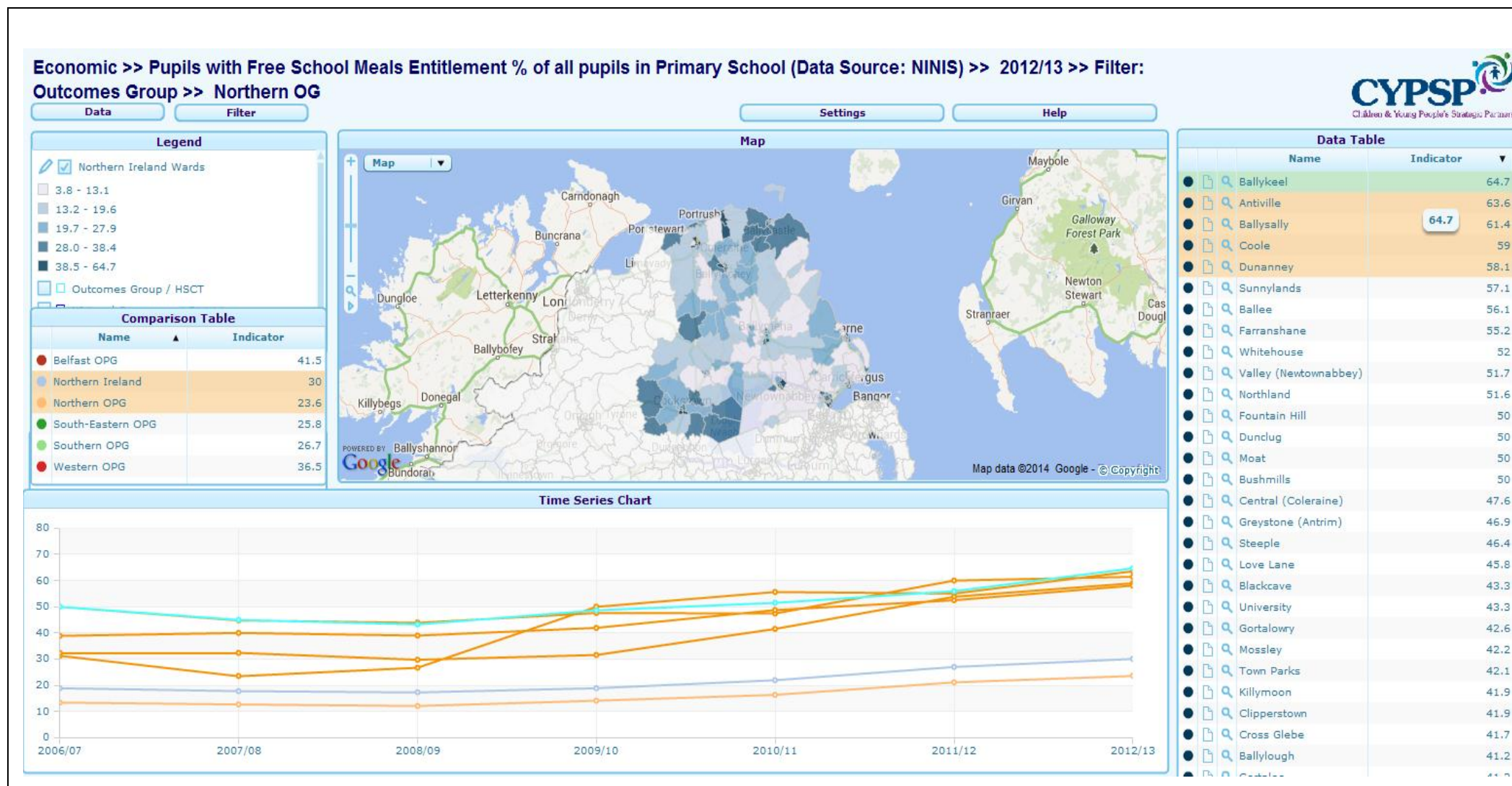

# LONE PARENTS WHO ARE INCOME SUPPORT CLAIMANTS DEC 2013

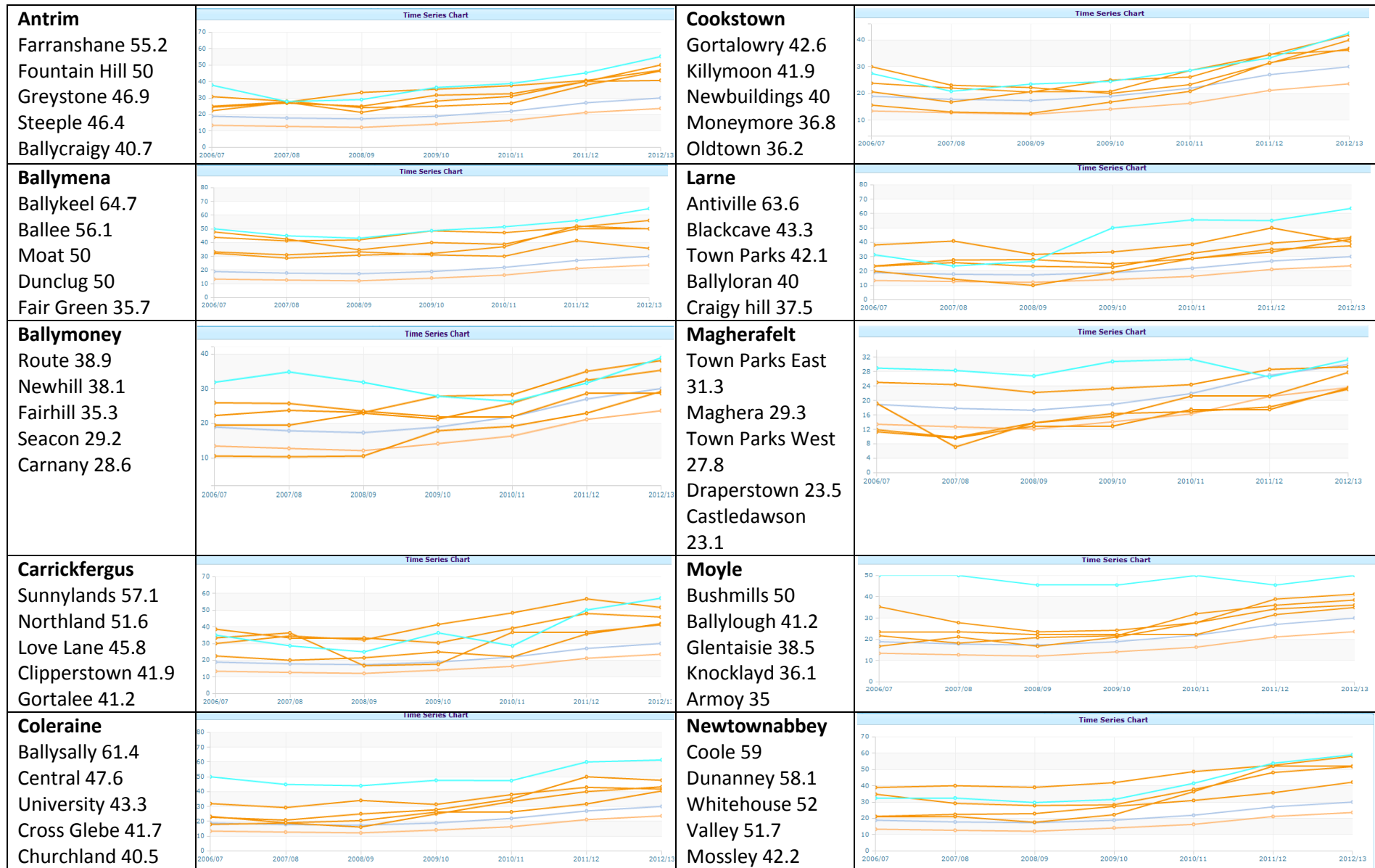

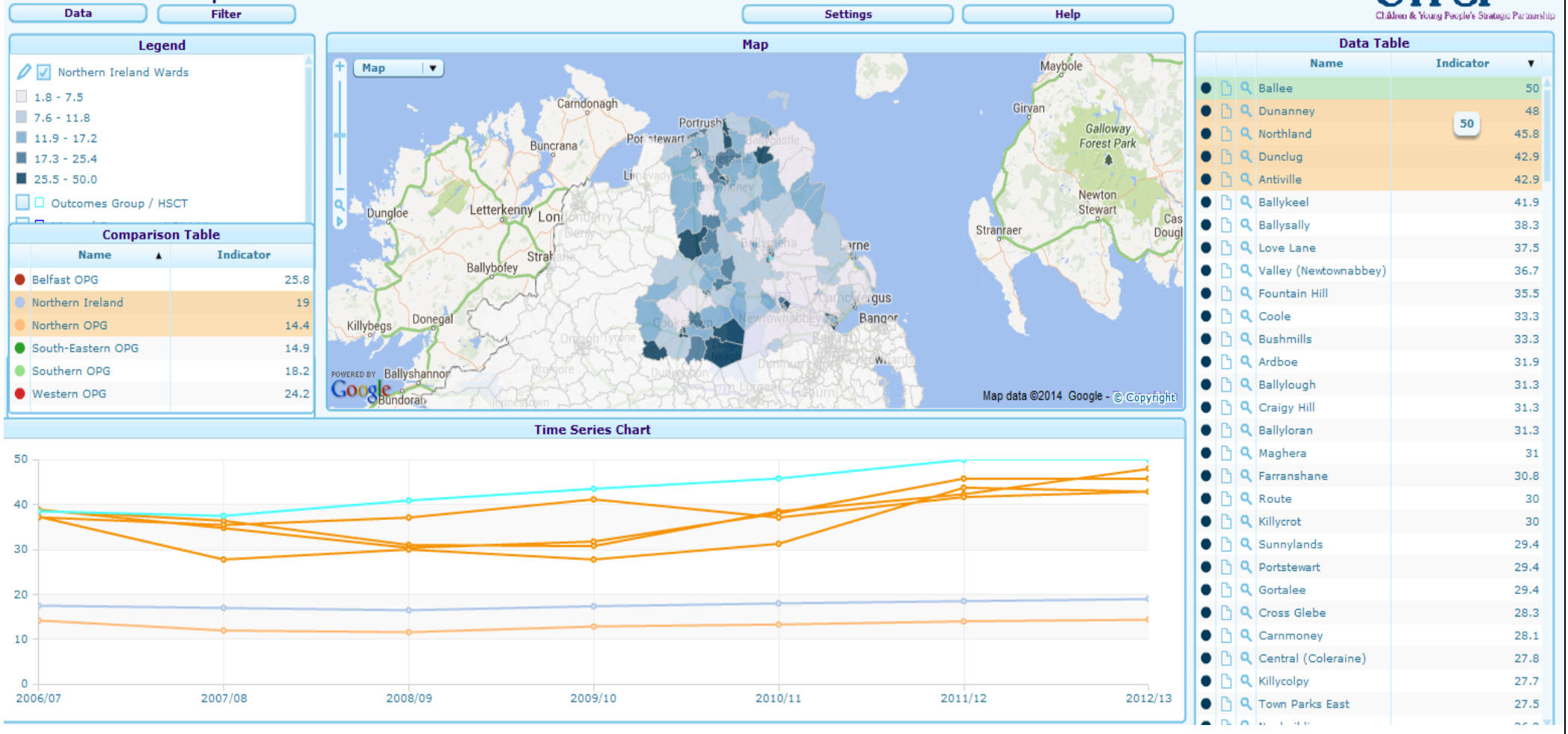

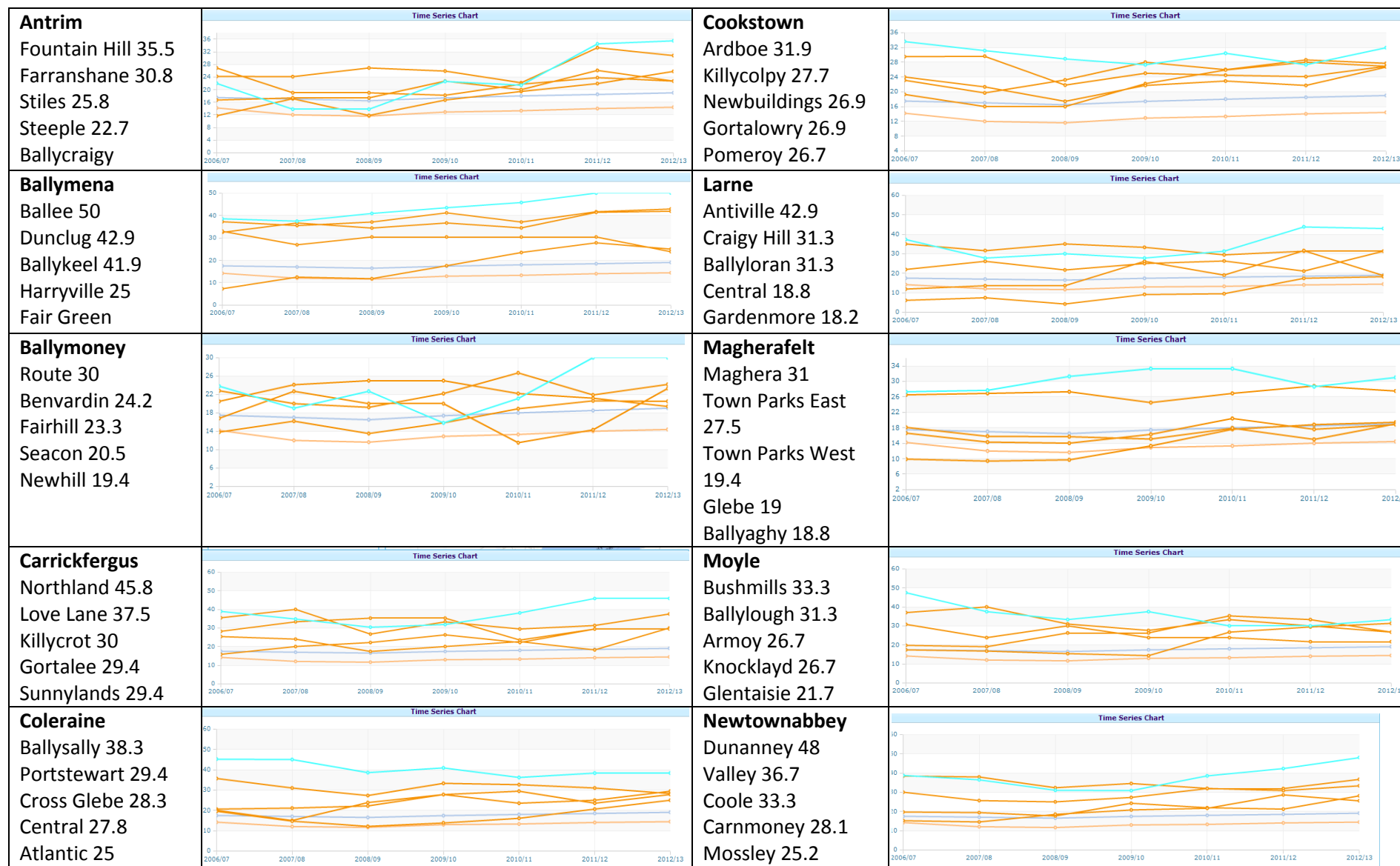

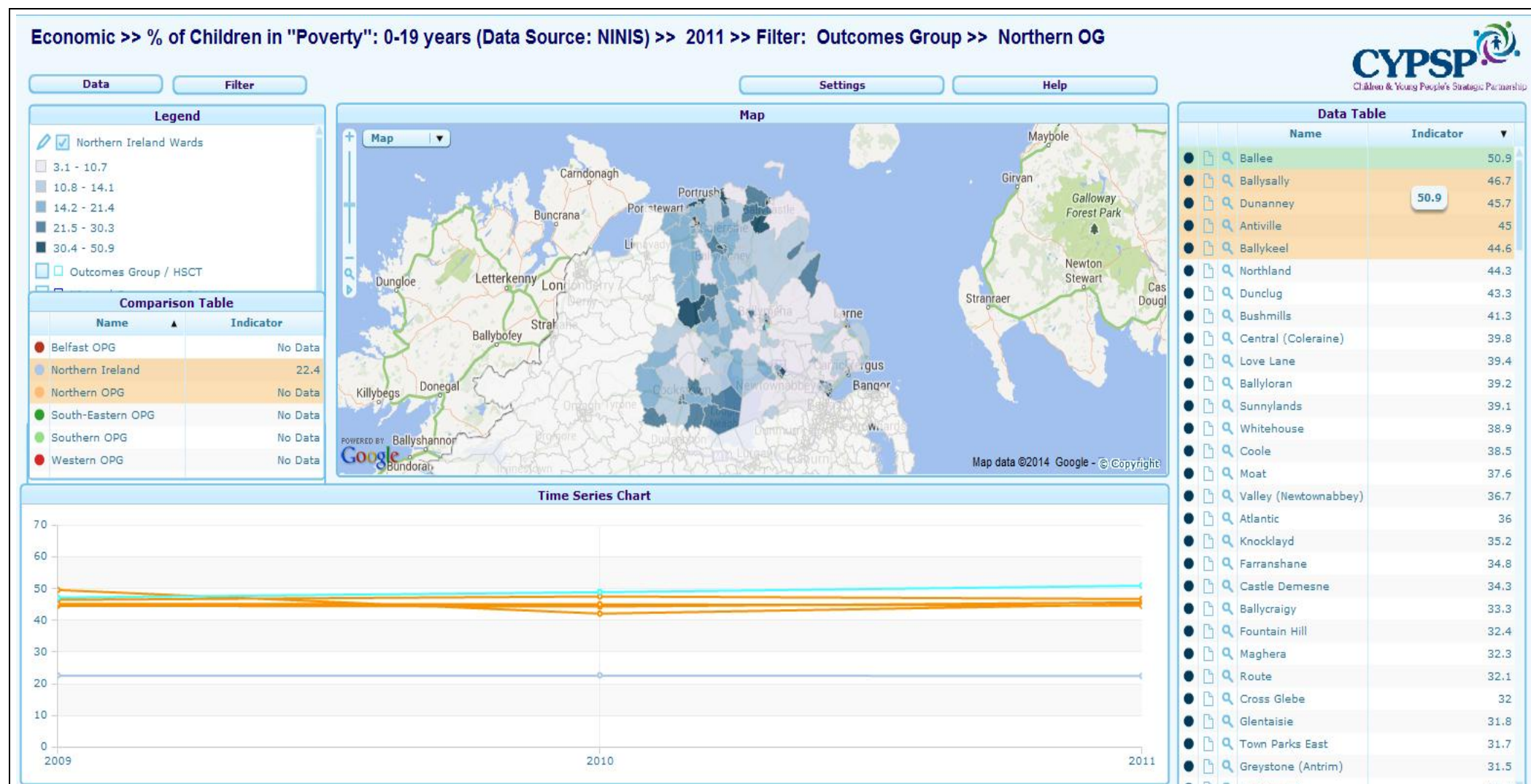

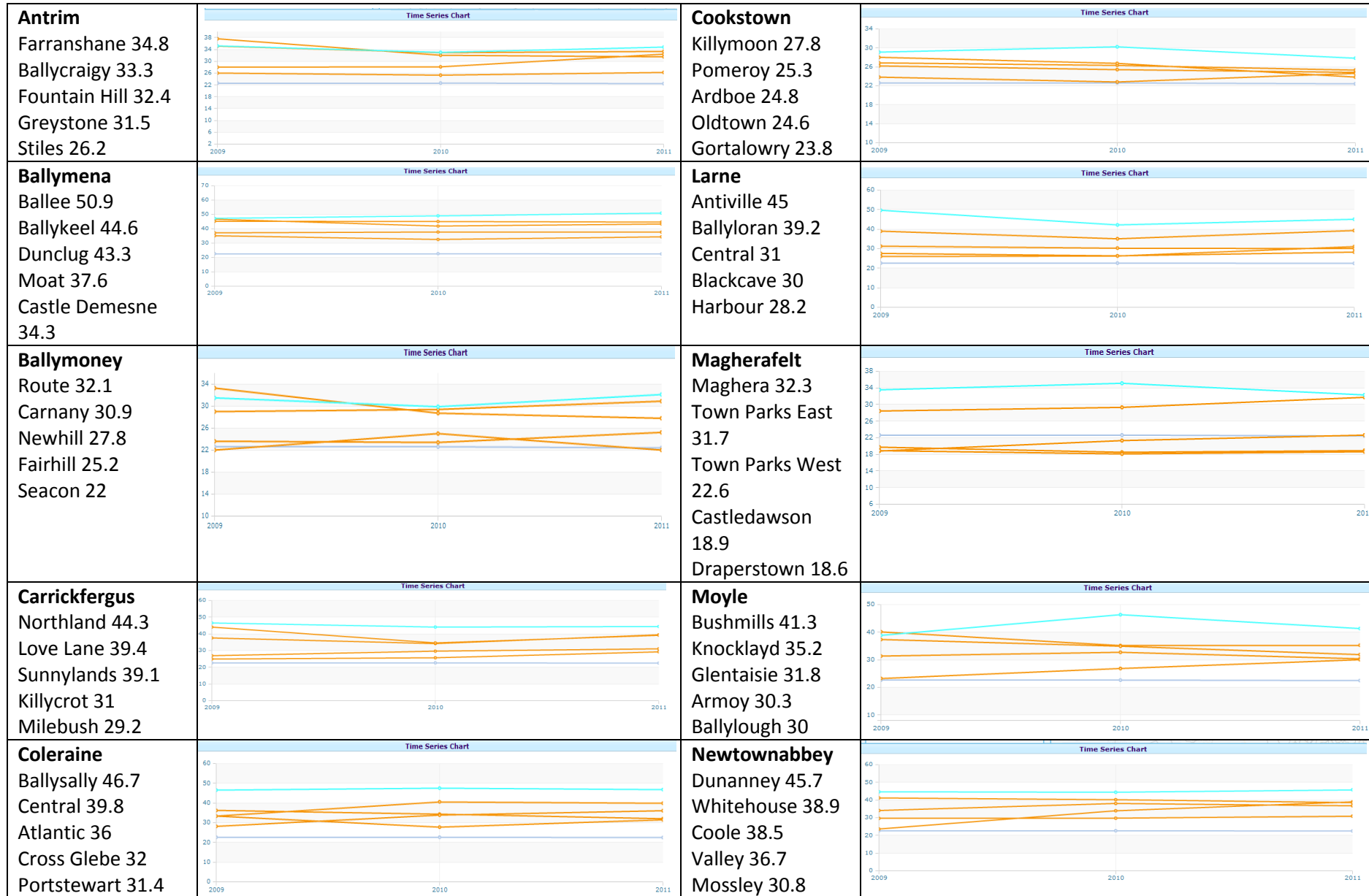
