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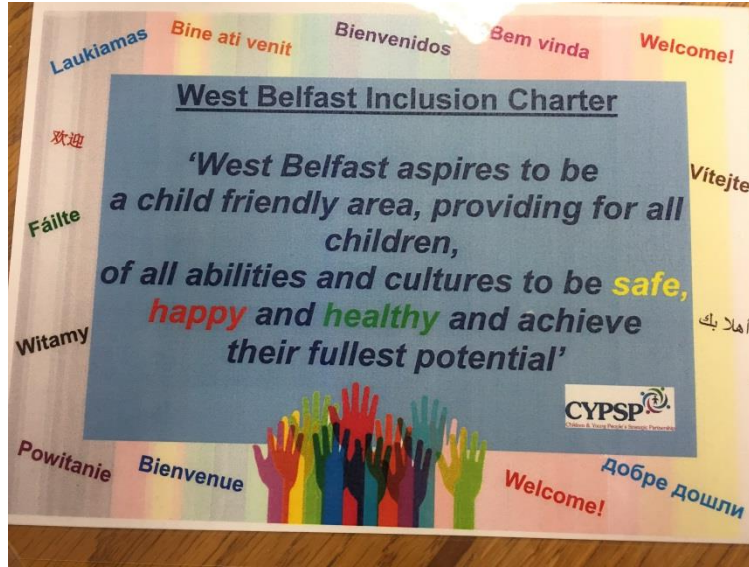

Background

Dungannon Locality Planning Group (LPG) was established in 2011 followed by The Rural Dungannon LPG in 2012. It was decided in 2016 to amalgamate the two groups into one. Membership of the group include a range of community, statutory and voluntary organisations with a remit for children and young people in the area. The group aims to improve the well-being of children and young people through a multiagency planning approach.

The group set their six priority areas for 2015-2017, one of them being to empower and support parents and families at risk.


The group decided that they wanted to host a School Uniform Drive within the Dungannon area aimed at secondary school children.

The outcome of the Uniform Drive was to:

1. Build further links with Schools, churches, SVP and LPG in the Dungannon area for future school uniform fairs.
2. Increase knowledge of various models for hosting school uniform fairs to run in the future.

Outcome 5 (SOG Action plan)

Children and young people live in supported families. Parents/carers receive the help and support they need to empower them to parent.



How much did we do?

- Worked with 2 schools during the summer from Dungannon LPG area
- 34 items of school uniforms donated at St Joseph's High School
- 6 families benefitted by obtaining school uniform items for their child/children

How well did we do it?

- Families were able to avail of uniform items to equip their children for the new school year
- Stronger partner links with school and St Vincent De Paul to make the uniform drive a permanent fixture
- Greater understanding by partners on different models of school uniform fairs

Is anyone better off?

5 evaluation forms completed by parents.

- 4 (80%) stated they thought the event was excellent in helping with school uniforms for their child/children. 1 (20%) stated it was fair.
- 4 (80%) rated the event as excellent. 1 (20%) rated it as fair

Background

Dungannon Locality Planning Group (LPG) was established in 2014. Membership of the group includes a range of community, statutory and voluntary organisations with a remit for children and young people in the area. The group aims to improve the well-being of children and young people through a multiagency planning approach.

The group set their six priority areas for 2015-2017; one of them being by equipping volunteers and staff with the awareness they need on co-ordination and collaboration across agencies.


The group decided that they wanted to host Scorecard Training to increase knowledge of the evaluation tool and its benefits in capturing outcomes.

The outcome of the workshop was to:

1. Increase knowledge on the Scorecard Model and presentation.
2. Increase confidence to use the Scorecard as an effective means of evaluation and communication.

Outcome 6 (SOG Action plan)



<p>Current Issues being Discussed at LPG: Including: Gaps in services/Emerging needs.</p>	<p>Identification of holiday hunger pilot programmes to run the month of August, 3 were identified throughout the West they were situated in LCDI Limavady, Caw/ Nelson Drive Action Group Derry and Extern Fermanagh. The need arose after it was raised at numerous localities about the need to offer opportunities for young people to avail of programmes that would have food included to tackle the growing concern around holiday hunger and children and young people going without substantial food over the holiday periods. It was raised that whilst this is a gap there needs to be a longer term strategy/plan put in place for groups to avail of funding to tackle this issue at grass roots level and the discussion should take place now to be in a position to roll a more substantial programme out over summer of 2018.</p>
<p>Recent Achievements by the Locality Planning Group. How much did we do? How well did we do it? Is anyone better off? (can be included as a report card)</p>	<p>There were 4 locality planning group meetings over this period, with the identification that the waterside area in Derry needs its own targeted children and young people group to try and establish a clear communication strategy and work alongside the local hub to raise the profile of each of the organisations providing support to children, young people and their families. Each locality planning group have identified areas of concern that they would like to see being addressed they included school suspensions and expulsions but more importantly the number of children and young people who anecdotally are on reduced timetables and they would like to see analysed the</p>

	<p>impact this has on the child's education but also the impact on the wider family as a whole including siblings and parents.</p> <p>Increasing emphasis has also been put on the number of children and young people presenting with EHWB issue to local services and hubs. The growing need for a targeted level 2 service for those presenting to services with EHWB issues has been discussed widely as the growing concern with CAMHS threshold and lack of level 2 service is having a huge impact on services in the community.</p>
<p>Engagement with Children and Young People, Parents/Carers: including numbers</p>	<p>This summer engagement with children and young people has taken part in the rural Derry communities with 2 separate sessions taken place in Park Village and Claudy village. Discussion occurred around what the issues were for children and young people living in rural parts of the country and what their views and opinions were on the one page plan.</p> <p>Access and availability of services remain key. Issues such as drugs and alcohol as well as mental health were key discussion topics.</p>
