

Launch of the UNICEF Child Friendly Communities Programme in the Western Outcomes Group Area at the Foyle Maritime Festival 2018

The CYPSP Western Area Outcomes Group, chaired by the Western Health and Social Care Trust (WHSCCT) in partnership with Derry City and Strabane District Council (DCSDC) officially launched their joint partnership programme Child Friendly Communities with UNICEF on Thursday 19th July 2018.

The event was attended by local young people as well as the Northern Ireland Children and Young People's Commissioner Koulla Yiasouma, the UNICEF Ambassador from UTV Paul Clark and senior members of staff from UNICEF, Western Health and Social Care Trust and Derry City and Strabane District Council.

The launch saw the beginning of a partnership that will ensure that Derry City and Strabane becomes the first region in Northern Ireland that is a child friendly community based on the UNICEF principals.

It will be;

- A place where the voices, needs, priorities and rights of children are considered and taken seriously. In this CFC in a Child Friendly City **all children**: will have a say about decisions that affect them. Can express their views freely and are encouraged and supported to do that.
- A place where children and families can access good health, education, transport and other services
- A place where children and families can feel safe and protected from discrimination and harm and can enjoy public spaces and meet other children freely.

The programme will work on the 7 Principles focused on a child's rights based approach it will focus on participation, dignity, life survival and development, it will be non-discriminatory and fully inclusive, there will be full transparency and accountability, it will focus on the best interests of our children and young people and it will focus interdependence and indivisibility.

Throughout this journey UNICEF will:

- ✓ provide a 'child rights lens' & implementation framework
- ✓ help develop a vision underpinned by child rights
- ✓ provide guidance and support
- ✓ advocate for partners' success
- ✓ build the capacity of the local workforce
- ✓ support awareness raising across the local community
- ✓ ask provocative questions, offer constructive critique
- ✓ support partners to achieve our common goals
- ✓ monitor progress and evaluate results
